Employment Service of Canada Extends Its Scope

A Post Office Extension Service Has Been Established to Take Care of Small Towns and Rural Districts. A Professional and Business Division of the Service also inaugurated to Look After Those Looking for Positions Who Are Specially Qualified.

The Employment Service of Canada which for the past year has been operating Government Employment Offices in the larger centres of the Maritime Provinces, is now extending its organization so as to better take care of the smaller towns and rural districts. Although the present Employment Offices have put forth every effort in the past to give as good service as conditions would allow to the outlying districts of their zone yet the employment work in their immediate vicinity kept them from giving as much attention as they would have liked to these districts.

THANKS FOR START IN DAIRY FARMING

OTTAWA, January 15.—I like the place fine and know I have got a good start in life, especially in the milk business when butter fat is 70 a pound," writes Joe Lewishin, of Vermillion, Alberta, to the District Agriculturist of the Soldier Settlement Board of Canada, at Edmonton. "I paid \$20 an acre for this quarter and I know it to be worth \$30 and it is so close to town, it is an ideal place for the dairy business. I wish to thank you and yours in the Soldier Settlement Board for the way in which you have handled your business in my case. You hear lots of ricks, but when we sit down and think, we realize what there is to go through at your end of it. Everything else is going fine here and was glad to have a real start in life."

Thus a farmer requiring help would go to the nearest Post Office and request of the Postmaster an order form which form is so drawn up that the farmer is able to give all particulars of the class of help required. After he has filled in the form, it is mailed to the nearest Government Employment Office and here an endeavor is made to forward a suitable applicant. If the Employment Office haven't such an applicant on their files, they refer this order to the nearest Clearing House where the procedure mentioned above is carried out. Should the Clearing House be unable to satisfy the demand of the farmer, if necessary it can then be referred to the Eastern Clearing House at Ottawa, who will circulate it through

out the Eastern Provinces. If the demand is unable to be met by this method, it is then circulated throughout the Western Provinces of Canada; thus the Employment Service has the necessary machinery to circulate this farmer's demand throughout every province in Canada which originated at a sub-Extension Office.

In the same manner as the above lady residing in the country might wish a domestic servant, she has only to apply to the nearest Postmaster and her order will be handled in the same way as the farmer's.

There will be about five hundred of these sub-Extension Offices of the Service established throughout the Maritime Provinces. Such Extension Offices will be supervised by the Government Employment Office that covers their zone. There are twelve such Government Employment Offices in the Maritimes at present, at the following places: New Brunswick—St. John, Fredericton, Moncton, Bathurst, Campbellton and Newcastle. Nova Scotia—Halifax, Sydney, New Glasgow, Amherst and Yarmouth. Prince Edward Island—Charlottetown.

The Extension Offices to be established under the Charlottetown Employment Office are as follows: Alberton, Albany, Baldwin's Road, Baltic, Bear River, Bedouque, Bellefleur, Bellefleur, Bloomfield, Bradabane, Cardigan, Cape Traverse, Cherry Valley, Clyde River, Cranston, Elmira, Emerald, French River, Georgetown, Hunt River, Inona, Kennington, Miscouche, Montague, Morrell, Mount Stewart, Murray Harbor, North Rustic, O'Leary, Peakes Station, Port Borden, Richmond, Souris East, St. Mary's Rd., Tignish, Vernon Bridge, Victoria.

Professional and Business Division

The need has been felt for some time of a special division in the Employment Service that would take care of demands for specially qualified workers looking for positions; also employers who require specially trained help such as Accountants, Bookkeepers, specially trained operators on machinery, etc. Therefore, the Professional and Business Section of the Service has been inaugurated to look after these problems. This Division of the Service is operated entirely apart from the system which handles the Trades Division already in operation and it is intended that special interviewers will be installed in all of the larger Employment Offices who are capable of classifying and appreciating the abilities possessed by professional and specially trained applicants for positions.

A separate Bulletin of this Division issued by the Clearing House at Moncton is already in the hands of all Government Employment Offices where specially trained men and women can go and take advantage of the vacancies listed thereon. The same applies to employers who are looking for special

trained workers. The Professional and Business Bulletin already has numerous professional and business applicants listed.

This Division has a special application form for applicants to fill in. It is so drawn up that it gives a specially trained worker adequate opportunity and space to state his qualifications.

Juvenile and Handicap Divisions. Two other Divisions which the Service are now inaugurating are the Juvenile and Handicap Divisions. The former is to handle the problem of boys and girls who are forced to leave school at an early age and go out to work. This is probably the most important division of all and will require very careful administration as the placing of a juvenile affects his whole career and those coming under this section must be given special consideration.

The Handicap Division, of course, will look after those who are minus a limb or through some accident or other are unable to take up the ordinary lines of work. For those coming under this Division an endeavor will be made to place them in positions suitable to their disability. This applies not only to returned soldiers, but to everybody, both men and women.

Once the above mentioned systems have been installed and running smoothly, Canada will have a very efficient Government Employment Service, which is free to both employer and employee and will be made up of the following divisions: Trades Division, Professional and Business Division, Women's Division, Juvenile Division, Handicap Division.
