ROBERT JAMES McDONALD, formerly of East Souris, who has been employed as a carpenter on wharf and bridge work in Boston, Mass., U.S.A., has secured a situation as a motorman on the East Boston surface cars of the Boston Elevated Railway.

Messrs. Crockett, McKinnon, Kane, Laidlaw, McPherson, Stubbart and Morrison, members of the North Sydney Hockey team are suspended from April 5th by the M.P.A.A. for refusing to continue play when ordered so to do by the Referee as a hockey match held in Halifax on March 9th, 1904, pending investigation.

J. W. McConnell** on the life of the great Napoleon Bonaparte and the Battle of Waterloo. J. T. Hawke presided. Mr. McConnell is rapidly gaining wide popularity in this city as a lecturer and the result of last night's effort proved that when next the rev. gentleman appears on the lecture platform he will require a much larger place for the accommodation of his audience. His instructive review of the life of Napoleon, his achievements on the field of battle and his ultimate defeat by the Duke of Wellington at the battle of Waterloo afforded a rich treat from a historical and literary standpoint. Mr. McConnell's eloquent and graphic description of the great battle which settled the question of supremacy between the allied forces of Europe and the army under Napoleon was a beautiful piece of word painting and he was followed by the large audience with rapt attention. Mr. McConnell spoke for over two hours and interspersed his remarks with many views which were thrown upon the canvas with remarkable distinctness. He also employed a couple of maps, made specially for the lecture, and these aided the audience greatly in following the lecturer in his description of the military operations in the life and time of the great French emperor and war general. The story was eloquently told and it is safe to say that it was enjoyed to the utmost by all present. The people of Charlottetown will be pleased to learn that the young men of the First Methodist Church have secured Mr. McConnell to deliver this lecture in this city on Thursday April 14th.
