The Conservatives will make no opposition to the re-election of Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux as Speaker of the House of Commons. Hon. Lemieux, who has been absent in Europe for over a month is on his way to Canada having sailed from England on the "Berenow" last Saturday.

The Montreal market today was quiet there being few firm bids in the domestic market. There continues to be a good demand from local and country buyers for American corn and a fairly large business was transacted. The demand for oats was quiet but prices were unchanged. Sales of car lots of Ontario and Quebec No. 2 white at 51 1/2 cents, and No. 4 white at 49 1/2 cents per bushel extra-truck, and Ontario malting barley sold at 85 1/2 cents per bushel extra-truck. The condition of the market for spring wheat was moderate-sized and prices were steady. Prices all grades of millfeed were advanced \$1.00 per ton while the tone of the market for standard grades of rolled oats was firm. Prices failed to show any change but this is expected in the near future. The egg market was quiet and steady. The butter and cheese market were inactive but the feeling was firm.
