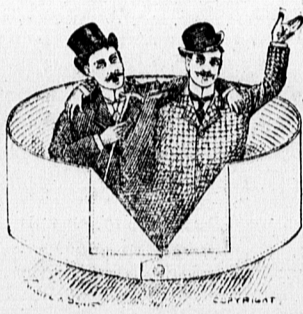

## BIG GEOLOGICAL FIND MADE AT TORONTO

TORONTO, Dec. 19.—Thirty-seven feet down in the blue clay under Toronto Bay they have found human foot-prints.

This find in the inter-glacial clay deposited from fifty to one hundred thousand years ago, is the most important geological discovery of that period made in America. Charcoal-remains of burnt wood—has been discovered in inter-glacial clay in the Don Valley, but nowhere in America have traces of human beings been discovered of such antiquity.

On November 13th, in the morning, the concreting gang in Haney & Millar's water works tunnel laid out for over thirty feet, a strata of blue clay six feet wide, in which there were over a hundred imprints of human feet encased in moccasins.

At the same level near the foot-prints, a piece of inter-glacial wood, some 12 inches long, was also found. The footprints were found one thousand feet from shaft No. 2, and at a place seventy feet below the water level of the bay.

Some hundred feet south of the big find at the same level some imperfect footprints were discovered. Prof. A. P. Coleman, of the University of Toronto, who is an authority on the inter-glacial period, says: "If the statements of these men are true, and there is no reason to doubt them, and the prints were in the blue clay, it is the most important find of the inter-glacial period ever made on the American continent."

Wood and charcoal have been found in the inter-glacial clay before in America, but no traces of men have been found. These prints would date back from fifty to one hundred thousand years ago.

## SANG AND DANCED UNTIL 100 YEARS OLD

DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 19.—Mrs. Mary Croteau is dead at Bay City at the age of one hundred and six years. She was born in the city of Quebec. Six years ago she fell out of her bed, inflicting an injury from which she never fully recovered. Up to the age of one hundred and three years she was still able to sing; the old French songs and dance steps in fashion seventy five and eighty years ago. During the last two years she lost her hearing and sight, and was in bed continuously during that length of time. She is survived by three children, all of whom are over seventy, and several grandchildren and great grandchildren. Her husband died about forty years ago.

## THE QUARANTINE WORRIES THE WEST

WINNIPEG, Dec. 19.—The Customs authorities at Winnipeg, have issued an order that is seriously handicapping imports from the States of New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland and Michigan.

It grows out of the fear that the foot and mouth disease which is said to be prevalent among the cattle of these states will be introduced into the Western Canada herds. The order prohibits the delivery of any importations from these states which may be packed in straw or hay being delivered until the package has been removed beyond the city limits and burned. These states ship into the Northwest quantities of goods at this season for the holidays and much delay in international traffic is resulting.

## BIG CANAL SCHEME TO GO THROUGH

OTTAWA, Dec. 19.—In reference to a cable dispatch stating that a syndicate of London financiers are preparing actively to undertake a Georgian Bay Canal scheme, Johnston, manager of the Georgian Bay Canal Co., stated that British capital with Canadian contributions has been obtained by the company for a considerable number of years. But beyond expending a large amount in a preliminary survey, nothing has yet been done.

Bishop had been in ill health for some time, and was told by a physician that he had cancer of the stomach and that nothing could be done. NEWCASTLE, Dec. 19.—Mrs. John MacDiarmid, a well known resident of Nelson, committed suicide yesterday morning. Her body was found by her daughter.

The deceased had been suffering for years with an illness that gave her much pain and caused temporary derangement. She was sixty, and is survived by a husband, two daughters and one son.
