THE RESULT

It will be yet some days before the result of the plebiscite polling through out the Dominion is accurately known.

Majority for prohibition 27,500.

At present British Columbia is represented as giving a small majority against prohibition, but it is quite possible that fuller returns may place its majority in the other column.

The situation is a peculiar one, with old Canada—the two provinces of before confederation—giving together a net majority of 26,000 against prohibition while the three provinces to the east and the provinces and territories to the west of old Canada collectively give a majority of 53,500 in favor of prohibition.

Our Ottawa despatch says it is generally understood that under the present conditions the government will decline to pass a prohibitory law. Before discussing what they ought to do we await fuller returns and some general expression of the leaders of the prohibition movement in Canada.

Somebody has written to the New York Sun that Canada is "ripe for a political change, but it must get a strong lead from outside."

It was well worth while to take the plebiscite. The government, parliament and people are alike instructed by the vote. The result is disappointing to the temperance people, but it is well that they should know just the state of the popular mind all over the country.

All honor to the clergymen, the temperance workers, the W. C. T. Union, the divisions of Sons of Temperance, the lodges of Good Templars and others who contributed their time, money and most untiring efforts to make the plebiscite campaign on this Island the great success it was!

On the roll of honor as places where not a single vote was cast in favor of the deadly liquor traffic are the following polling divisions: St. Catherine's, Cherry Valley, Southport, and Whim Road Cross.
