

A. By Law for levying and specifying the rate of Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property and Poll in the City of Charlottetown for a Water and Sewerage fund under Statute 1, Edward VII Chapter 2.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

The rate of assessment on Real Estate for a Water and Sewerage fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the Assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the general assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal property, liable to taxation in said City and all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned by them on the 10th day of May A. D. 1906.

2nd. The rate of assessment on Personal Property for such Water and Sewerage purposes for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one quarter of one per cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the assessors of the said City in said general Assessment Book and Valuation Roll made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

3rd. The amount of Poll tax to be paid by every person returned by the said assessors in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll as liable thereto for such water fund under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of twenty five cents on every poll of every person so assessed and returned as aforesaid.

A. By law for levying and specifying the rate of assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes under Statute 3 Edward VII Chapter 17. Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

1st. The rate of assessment on Real Estate for general civic purposes under said Statute for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one and one eighth per cent on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the assessors of the said City of Charlottetown in the General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal property liable to taxation in said City and all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein made and duly returned by them on the 10th day of May A. D. 1906.

2nd. The rate of assessment on Personal Property for such general civic purposes for the year commencing the first day of January A. D. 1906 and ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906 is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of one and one eighth per cent on every dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the assessors of the said City in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

A. By law for allowing the rate of Discount on the assessments on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes for the current year ending the thirty first day of December A. D. 1906. Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

1st. A discount at the rate of two and one half per cent shall be allowed to all Tax payers who shall, on or before the twentieth day of July A. D. 1906 pay the City Clerk at his office the taxes severally due by them for the current year on Real Estate and Personal Property for civic purposes.

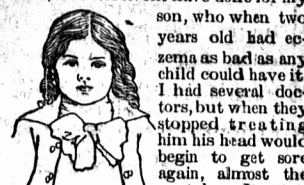

In addition to this The Montreal Herald of May 30th has the following expression of opinion of a well known professional man:
"Talking to a reporter recently a well known professional man who travels considerably remarked: "I always enjoy the trip by the Maritime Express between Montreal and Halifax. 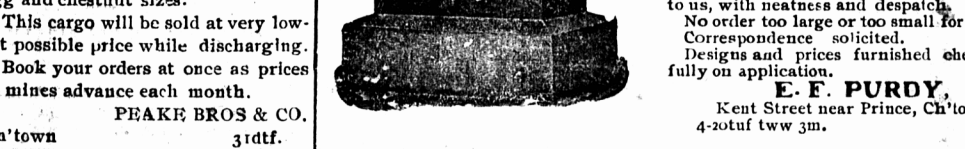
