THE NEXT BRITISH CENSUS.

It seems strange that hitherto in the British Isles there has been no official enumeration of the number of adherents of the various religious creeds. In Canada and the United States the official census has long taken account of credal distinctions and given the numbers of each religious body.

As the London Times tells, the omission was deliberate. The Government did not want a religious census and the opposition did not want it, but the provision was inserted in the House of Lords against the wishes of the party leaders who could not control their followers.
