Effects of Repeated Dressings of Slag

It is a matter of common observation that when one applies a dressing of Slag, the effects reach their maximum about the third year, and from that time onwards there is a gradual decline in productivity, until the field returns to its original condition.

How slow is the decline is shown by the results at Cockle Park, Sevington and Cransey. At each of these stations a plot (No. 3) got one-half ton per acre, and nothing more for nine years, in the case of the first two stations, and eight years in the case of the last named. At the end of these periods the Slagged plot at Cockle Park was producing three times as much meat as the continuously unfertilized ground, while at the other two stations the yield was 70-80 per cent. greater.

It is sometimes said that repeated doses of Slag do not act as well as earlier applications. Work at Cockle Park gives definite information as to the extent of the reduced effect of repeated dressings at that station. Plot No. 4 at Tree Field received five cwt. per acre of Baltic Slag for 1897, 1900, 1905, 1912, 1915 and 1918, each application supplying 100 lbs. Phosphoric Acid. There is an interval of three years between all dressings, except between the second and third, when the interval is six years. The subjoined table gives the aggregate live weight increase per acre for two years immediately following the respective dressing. The corresponding figures for the unfertilized plot:

7th dose of Slag	1918 232	63

It will be seen that the maximum production was reached with the second and third doses, and there is a rather serious falling off for the fourth, there is a distinct and progressive recovery in the fifth, sixth and seventh doses, and in any case the dressings of Slag have throughout been highly profitable, and fertility has been well maintained, at a level of about four or five times above that of the unfertilized ground.

Many farmers of the Maritime Provinces have an idea that the reason repeated doses of Slag do not give the same results as the first doses of "Old Country" Slag was due to the inferiority of the Sydney Slag, but after a careful perusal of the above, showing results for twenty-one years in England, with the best quality of pre-war Slag, it is equally plain that in all cases a dressing of Slag has been highly profitable.
