Questions in connection with the welfare and advancement of denominational interests were discussed by the lay clerical and delegates in a broad tolerant and enlightened spirit.—Some ten clergymen were present, who in intellectual attainments, theological acquirements, ripe scholarship and wide culture, would compare most favorably with those of any similar assembly or with the members of any preceding Association. Ten years ago they met here last, and something remarkable, and proving the fact that the Baptist ministry in liberant in practice though not in theory, not a clergyman present then, was here at this Association. Another observation of the ten preachers present, not one was a native of the Island, emphasizing the statement of nineteen hundred years ago that a prophet has no honor in his own country.
