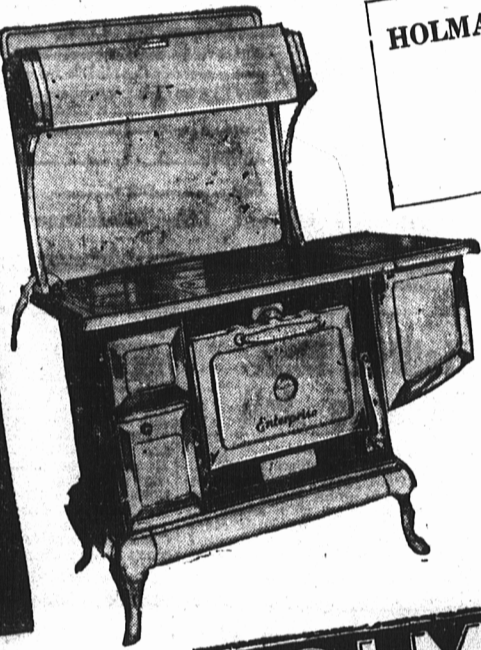

Tense Realism In Picture Of Fighting Boys At Capitol

Daring in its content and lifted alive and throbbing from a big city's streets, Universal's emotionally charged drama, "Newsboys' Home," proved compelling screen fare to all who attended the picture's opening at the Capitol Theatre last night. Highlighted by the grim realism faced by ill-clad boys who fight their battles on noisy street corners, the picture stars Jackie Cooper and features Edmund Lowe, Wendy Barrie, Edward Norris and Samuel S. Hinds with Universal's rough and ready band of Little Tough Guys who make believable their roles as hard-fisted and self-reliant newsboys. The film story by Gordon Kahn and Charles Grayson shows the ragged news vendors battling oppressive gangsters in spectacular scenes in which trucks are wrecked, newsstands smashed and beaten and newstands smashed and burned. Matching the graphic action of the film is the sharply etched story in which Jackie Cooper as the country boy who seeks shelter in "Newsboys' Home" fights his way to leadership of the ruffian newsboy gang. Edmund Lowe does his usual fine job as the quiet-witted editor and Samuel S. Hinds lends dignity and force to his role of the kindly publisher. Romantic scenes are ably carried by Wendy Barrie as Edmund Lowe's sweetheart and Edward Norris invests his portrayal of the ruthless mobster with convincing menace.

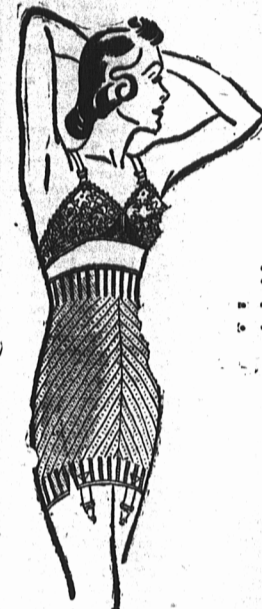
