FOX MEETING.—A meeting of the leading foxmen and all interested in the welfare of the fox industry in this province will be held in the Board of Trade rooms at 10 sharp this morning. The object of the meeting is to consider matters of vital importance to the fox industry.

S., during the next week or so, and is to come on to Charlottetown when they have completed their engagement there. A short season of performances will be given in this town. The advance agent of the circus was in Charlottetown last week.

INTERESTED CLASS.—The Live Stock Judging Class which was held at Launching on July 7th was a grand success, and was attended by nearly all the farmers of the surrounding section. The class was composed of Dairy Cows and Calves. Mr. Robert Robertson of the Provincial Department of Agriculture was in Charge, and held the attention of those present for about four hours. The people were then asked to place the Cattle in order of merit which brought out considerable difference of opinion. After considerable discussion, Professor Robertson made his placing, and said very plainly why he did so. Those present felt that it was one of the best afternoons they had had for a long time, and that more information, generally, could not have been given in any other way. The thanks of this settlement are due the Department of Agriculture and more particularly Professor Robertson, for his excellent work, and it is hoped that in the near future he will be back to Launching again.

ANOTHER FOX COMPANY.

Notice of application for the incorporation of another fox company appears in Saturday's Royal Gazette. The company will be named "The Empire Black Fox Company, Limited," with a capital stock of \$150,000 and with their head office in Charlottetown. The Directors are Dr. Geo. Carruthers, Dr. H. E. McEwen of O'Leary, Dr. A. E. Palmer of Coleman, J. T. Lantz and John F. Wheat of this city. Mr. Walter J. Lantz who has just returned from Saskatchewan to permanently reside here will be the Secretary-Treasurer. The ranch is to be located on the outskirts of the city on the beautiful and splendidly situated property known as "Kilburn" and the stock will include only foxes of the royal Island strain.

CROP PROSPECTS.—The recent rainfalls and warm weather have made a great improvement in all the crops throughout the Province, but none have responded to the same extent as the grain. The cold weather seemed to have been favorable to the development of a good system, the result of which is being seen in the rapid elongation of the stock. At the time of writing it looks as if the grain crop would be much better than average, and the number of entries that are made in the Fields of Standing Grain Competitions would seem to indicate that many fields are of excellent quality. The number of prizes offered this year is, however, much greater than last year which perhaps accounts for the number of entries coming in. Full information can be had from the Department of Agriculture.

HELPFUL MEETING.—The Cornwall-York and Meadow Bank Institutes held a joint meeting in the Cornwall School house on Monday, July 7th, at 3 p. m. Both Institutes were well represented. Mrs. George Macdonald President of Cornwall-York Institute presided. Preserving and canning was the subject under discussion. Miss Charlotte Howard read a very instructive paper on the principles of canning and preserving. Mrs. D. Macpherson explained her method of canning strawberries and also chickens; several others exchanged ideas in regard to the canning of different fruits and vegetables. The subject selected for the August meeting of the Cornwall-York Institute was The Improvement of the School, the meeting to be held in the York Point School house.

WOMEN'S INSTITUTES.—On Thursday afternoon a number of ladies specially interested in Women's Institute work met in the schoolhouse at East Wiltshire. The supervisor was present to explain and describe the movement and after the matter was fully discussed it was decided to organize an Institute to include the women of East Wiltshire and Warren Grove School districts. The following are the officers for this newly formed Women's Institute: President—Mrs. Frank Howard; Vice-President—Mrs. Oliver Warren; Directors—Mrs. Cass, Miss Scott, Mrs. J. MacKinnon, Mrs. R. MacKinnley, Mrs. G. Owen; Secy-Treas—Mrs. Vickerson. It was decided to hold monthly meetings, alternately in each district, the first meeting to be held in the Warren Grove School on Wednesday, Aug. 13th, at seven p. m., when the subject of School Improvement is to be the chief topic. There will also be a Question Box at this meeting and it is hoped the ladies will come prepared to make this first meeting a very interesting one.
