Arthur J B Mallish, barrister, of Charlottetown, has just arrived from England with his bride. It will be remembered that Mr Mallish, who is a captain of Militia and A D C to the Governor of P. E. Island, served through the late war in South Africa. He first met Miss Hutton, his future wife, at Cape Town, when on his way to the front. This acquaintance was renewed when he was returning home from the war, and the marriage took place at St. James' Church, Southampton, England, on the 17th of last month. A very appropriate address was delivered on the occasion by the officiating clergyman, the Rev. Alan R Wood, of the London College of Divinity. The address has been published and reads as follows:

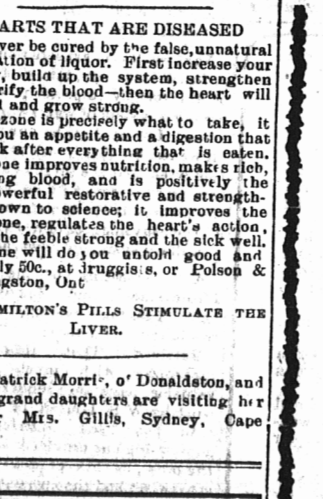
MY FRIENDS.—We are met together this afternoon under circumstances of deep solemnity and also of exceptional interest. It was in God's providence an answer to the call of the 'Mother' Country that brought these two hearts together. Some few years ago what an awakening we had with regard to the bond which exists between us and the Colonies. How our hearts burned! How the world wondered! Out of that war, for two at least, sprang love and now the Mother Country witnesses a loyal son claim his chosen bride. Many of us, perhaps most of us are strangers to you, and yet we dwellers in the Mother Country claim kinship with you, and our hearts go out toward you with prayers for God's blessing on your married life. War speaks of toil, strenuous exertion, anxiety, peril and death. Love speaks of rest. That is one thought which I would give you today. Marriage is God's own ideal, and it is the happiest estate if His fear dwells in our hearts. There is no earthly rest like the rest of home! Great men, warriors, statesmen enjoy the honours of life, and are conscious of pleasure in promotion and distinction, but their biographies tell us how they turn to home as the highest joy of all. Yes, nothing can compensate the loss of a happy home, and we should seek in every way to make it a refreshment and a delight by doing our best to promote its peace and purity. Both of you are gainers today. Let God be a gainer too. (1) By your daily praises and blessing God for His Providence that has brought you into this relation. 'I obtained favor of the Lord.' (2) By living to God in this relation, performing the duties of it so as your converse may be some lively resemblance of the communion between Christ and His Church. (3) By being mutual helps to one another in the best things, by the advancement of piety and godliness. The love of Christ does not only enforce the husband's duty as an argument, but shows the right manner of it as a pattern. Christ's love is sanctifying love; so should yours be, such a love as shows itself by sincere and real endeavors to bring about one another's spiritual and eternal good. Love one another 'as heirs, together of the Grace of Life' You have begun your married life in the presence of God—let it be continued as in that presence! Let me repeat my message of last Sunday. There is One above who is interested in all your concerns—to whom you can go together in times of difficulty and trial, and get guidance and sympathy—yes, and do not forget it, in times of joy and happiness too. 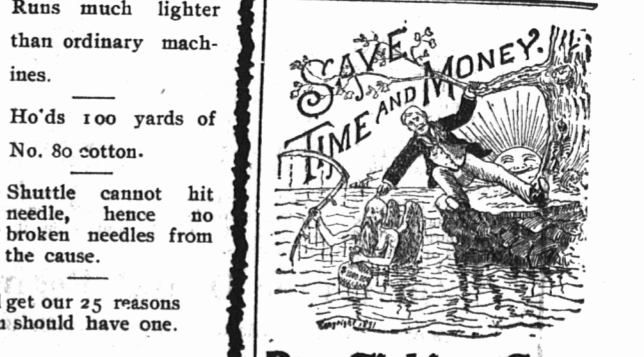
