HOUSE MET AT 11.45

Before the order of the day was taken up Mr. J. H. Bell arose on a question of privilege. He complained that an article in The Guardian of recent date had charged him with deliberate falsification of documents in connection with the Dalton Sanatorium and that he had refused to apologize or to retract. He proceeded to explain that he had been maligned.

MR. PATON. You did resign your seat in Charlottetown. Why?

MR. HUGHES. That was a hard slide. Continuing Mr. Hughes reverted to the Falconwood Hospital matter, not he said, because he wanted to, but because he was reminded by the Guardian that he had not touched the question this session. He proceeded to denounce the management of the institution, its extravagance, etc.

MR. HUGHES continued, making charges about waste and extravagance alleging that large quantities of beef had been spoiled in cold storage.

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AFTERNOON SESSION

House resumed at 4 o'clock. THE SPEAKER submitted, in writing the following written ruling in the question of privilege raised in the morning by Mr. J. H. Bell.

When the Leader of the Opposition was speaking on a question of privilege this morning, the Premier raised a point of order that the Leader of the Opposition could not take occasion of a newspaper article to lay the foundation for a speech, that if he complained of the article and claimed it to be libellous he must take the proper steps, and by motion have the editor summoned as set down by the rules.
