The last general election was held on 23rd June, 1898. At that time three Conservatives and two Liberals were declared elected in P. E. Island:

- A. C. Macdonald, Kings, 15 majority.
- John Yeo, East Prince, 117 "
- E. Hackett, West Prince, 45 "
- A. Martin, East Queens, 354 "
- L. H. Davies, West Queens, 334 "

Mr. Hackett was unseated and a new election held in West Prince, April 27, 1897 when Mr. S. F. Perry was elected by 87 majority.

Mr. Perry died and at a by-election held April 13, 1898 Mr. B. D. McLellan was elected by 316 majority.

In East Prince on the appointment of Hon. John Yeo to the Senate, a by-election was held 14th December 1898, when Mr. J. H. Bell was elected by a majority of 50.

In the stirring campaign in St. John county they manage to have a little fun occasionally to enliven the conflict. Dr. Stockton is the Conservative, and Col. Tucker the Liberal candidate. Dr. Stockton at one of his meetings told the story of a man who, looking about his wife's sewing machine for an article he needed, came across a small shiny contrivance of which he did not know the use, until his wife informed him it was a "tucker." She said she never used it, it was no good, but it was "part of the machine." There was laughter and applause over this play upon the Liberal candidate's name, in which the gallant Colonel, had he been present, must certainly have joined.

In Essex, the most western county of Ontario and close in touch with the Michigan border, there is this time in the field a candidate who desires to sever the connection between Canada and Great Britain. The candidate referred to is a Frenchman, not a French Canadian, and is in fact a United States pensioner. There is a little knot of annexationists in Essex, who ran their own candidate, a Mr. McNeill, in 1896. He received exactly 70 votes out of a total of over 5,200 that were polled, and of course forfeited his election deposit.

It appears that the return of the Imperial Volunteers to London was signalled by wild scenes of riotous debauchery, in which fortunately and to their credit, but few of the Volunteers took part. We shall doubtless do better than this in welcoming home our own returning soldiers. It will be well that all things connected with the reception shall be characterised by sobriety and order.

The Semi-Weekly Watchman in its desire to support the opposition cause think it desirable, if possible to raise a controversy with THE GUARDIAN. From what we see and hear of the political campaign, we are of the opinion that the party organs on both sides have about enough to do to make good their cause without verbally assailing those who are only standing by and looking on.
