PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND MISS GRANT AT WORK

Miss Edna Grant, Travelling Secretary of the Woman's Christian Temperance Union, has been touring the province for several weeks in the interest of Temperance. Miss Grant spoke in the United Churches, North Wiltshire and the following day she addressed the children in the school. On Friday she met some of the full-blooded Cornwalls, she also addressed the children of the United Church Sunday School in New Glasgow, and in the evening spoke in the Church of York. A union meeting of young people from Clyde River, St. Catharines, Cornwall and Bonshaw, arranged by Mrs. Fred Shaw, was held in the Bonshaw Hall on Sunday 20th. Miss Grant presided at the gathering, and led the recreation period which followed. She was assisted in this, by Mrs. Gordon Macdonald.

EXPENSIVE PROFITS

The Provincial Treasurer has announced that the liquor revenue of Ontario for the past year totals nearly twenty million dollars. Much prominence is given to the promise to earmark some of this liquor profit for education. It is hoped that the conscience of Old Man Ontario will be soothed by knowing that these gains are devoted to worthy ends.

RATION BOOKS

There are now 280,000 beer ration books distributed in Saskatchewan, and 285,000 liquor ration books. Beer ration books expire March 31, 1946, and liquor ration books December 31, 1946. Provincial Treasurer C. M. Pines said the retail price of spirits in Saskatchewan would be reduced if the Dominion Government ceded the 1945 increase of \$2 per proof gallon excise tax without raising the strength of the liquor now being sold in Canada, but if the Dominion Government removes its increase in excise tax and the strength of liquor was restored to pre-war strength of spirits, the retail price would not be reduced in Saskatchewan.

F. O. F. K. BEERS REPORTED DEAD

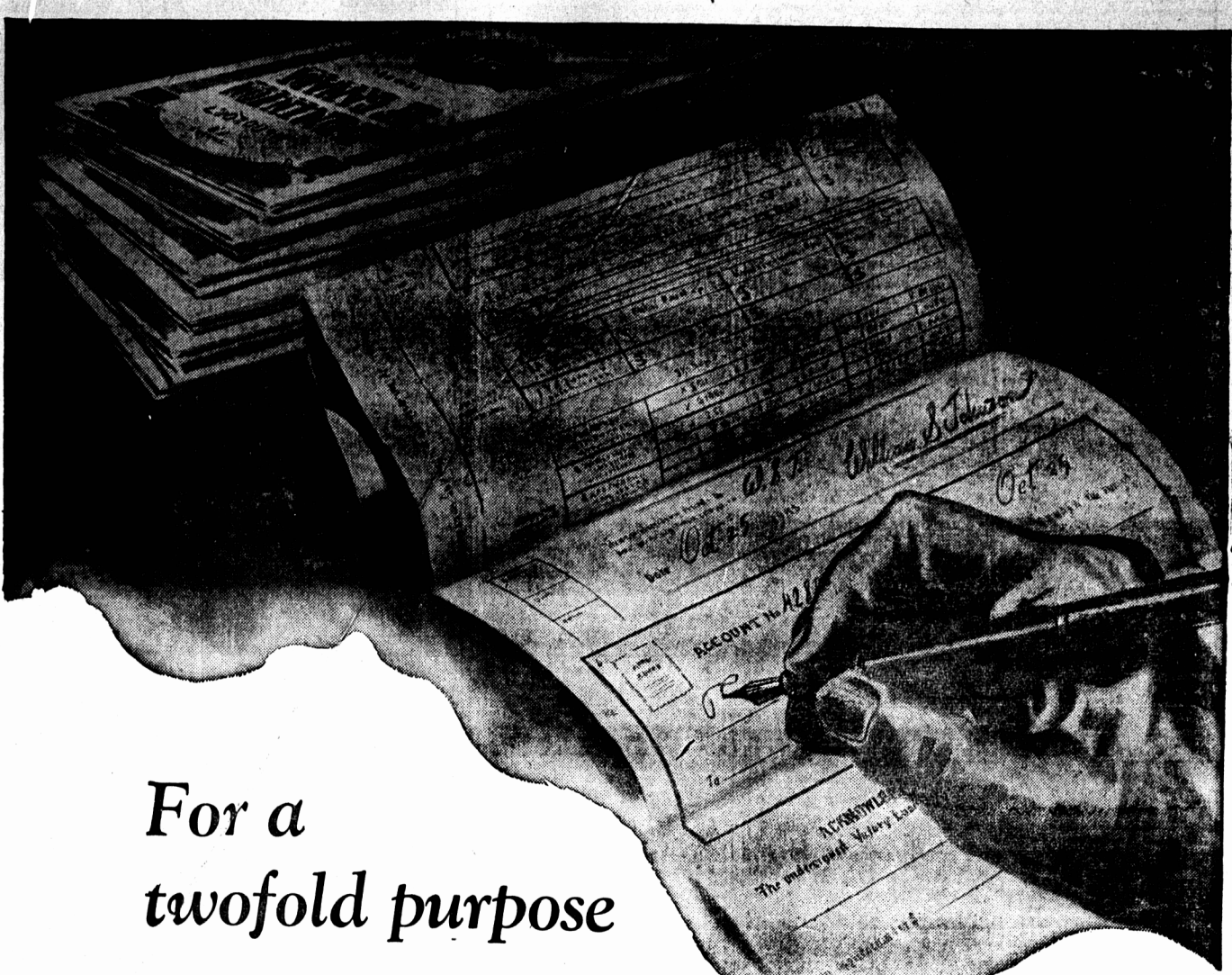
Missing for more than a year Flying Officer F. Kenneth Beers, only son of Mrs. F. E. Donnet, 67 West Street, is now, for official purposes presumed dead. He was first reported as missing on the night of July 24-25 when on flying operations over Stuttgart, Germany. PO. Beers was 27 years of age and prior to his enlistment in the Air Force in February, 1943, he was a stenographer on the staff of the time office of the C.N.R. here. After joining the air force, he took an accountant's course at the R.C.A.F. Station in St. Thomas, Ont., where he was stationed for some time before being posted to Summerside, P. E. I., and in 1944 re-mustered to aircrew and trained at Windsor, Ont., R.C.A.F. Station. Flying Officer Beers was a member of Wesley Memorial United Church and he had many friends in his home city who will learn with regret of his death on active service. He is survived by his wife, formerly Miss Kay MacKenzie, at one time physical instructor at Moncton, N. B., and two children, Fred Beers, was a well known C.N.R. conductor on the Northern Division and met death some years ago in a train collision at Acadiaville.
