MARSHALL CONSTABLE

The people of New London and vicinity were shocked and saddened on Saturday, January 3rd, when it was learned that Marshall Constable had passed away suddenly at his home at the age of 70 years.

Born at Long River, November 11th, 1883, he was the youngest son of the late Joseph and Mrs. Constable.

While he had been in failing health for the past year, he was able to work leisurely in his work shop until a few hours before his death. An excellent carpenter by trade, his last undertaking was the pulpit and communion table for the new United Church at New London. Many fine houses and other buildings stand as monuments of his ability.

His passing will be regretted, not only by his immediate family but also by many friends and neighbors who always found Mr. Constable ready and willing to give a helping hand, when and wherever needed.

He married Florence Cole, only daughter of the late David Cole, of New London, where together they established a fine home which has always been noted for its hospitality. He leaves to mourn the loss of a loving husband and father, his widow, also two sons and two
