

Harper Tyndall and Miss F. Maude Scantlebury, were united in marriage. Rev. G. Elmer Mosseman, officiating. Both bride and groom were unattended. Mrs. Tyndall was formerly a popular telephone operator at the local exchange, and later of Medford. Mr. Tyndall is employed by W. R. Park & Sons, and enjoys a large circle of friends. After a honeymoon spent in Washington and New York, Mr. and Mrs. Tyndall will reside in their new home on Clinton Street. The Miss Scantlebury referred to is a daughter of Mr. George Scantlebury, of Kent Street, Charlottetown, P. E. Island.

Following a short illness from pneumonia, Mr. William B. Newcome, who, for thirty-five years had been in business in Toronto as a law stationer, died on the fifth at his residence, Gloucester street at the age of sixty-five.

Deceased was a life long conservative of the old school, and was one of the men who helped to build up the party in that city. Although never seeking any office he always took the strongest possible interest in politics. He was a friend of the late Sir John Macdonald, and during the forty years of his residence in Toronto there was no better known Conservative, and few, if any who succeeded him in the strength of his political convictions, or the activity of his interest in the Conservative Association.

He was born at Craupaud, in 1849, and was twenty-five years of age when he went to live in Toronto, where he has continuously resided ever since. In conjunction with the late C. C. Robertson he formed the Young Men's Conservative Club of which he was elected president for two terms. He was a member of the Board of Trade, but was never associated with any fraternal societies. He was a member of the Central Methodist Church.

Deceased is survived by three sons Messrs. John of Toronto; Gordon of Spokane, Wash., and George of Chicago, and three brothers, Messrs. W. S. of Charlottetown, Chadford and Albert, Chicago; and one sister Mrs. J. R. Bowness, of Beedeque.
