SALT IN RATIONS GOOD FOR PIGS Due to the fact that brine or an excessive amount of salt will cause serious digestive disorders or even death to a pig, some feeders consider salt as harmful and do not include it in the ration. Experimental results have shown that salt is just as essential to a pig as to any other farm animal. The rate of grain is increased and a more economical use of feed results when salt is fed regularly. Salt is essential for the digestion and assimilation of feeds and should be supplied in suitable quantities, especially to animals that are kept enclosed in buildings. At the Dominion Experimental Farm, Brandon, Man., salt is included in the protein-mineral supplement or mixed with the basal meal mixture at the rate of one pound of salt with each hundred pounds of feed for pigs of all ages.

PEPPER SUPPLY For some time there has been considerable apprehension among Canadian housewives regarding the possible necessity for the continued use of wartime substitutes for pepper. With regard to this, the Canadian Trade Commissioner at Singapore writes that there are ample supplies of various types of pepper available for immediate export from Singapore and prospective Canadian buyers can be supplied with firm offers at any time.

APPLE BREAD 2 cups sifted all-purpose flour 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon baking powder 1-3 Cup mild-flavoured fat 1/4 cup sugar 1 cup ground or finely grated unpeeled raw apples 1/2 cup wheat germ 1/2 cup sour milk Sift flour, salt, baking soda and baking powder. Cream fat, add sugar and cream well together. Add apple and wheat germ. Add dry ingredients alternately with sour milk. Bake in a greased loaf pan, 4 1/2" x 10", in a moderate oven, 360°F., for about 45 minutes.

The Staff Of Life

The "Staff of Life" is bread, but as the staff upon which the weary traveller leaned was sometimes severely plain, sometimes intricately carved, so bread may have many variations. The term "bread" includes yeast breads and rolls as well as "quick breads" which are made with baking powder. Among the latter are loaf breads, biscuits, scones and muffins. That mouth watering aroma of hot bread sends out a welcome to the family when days grow shorter and evenings cooler. An old recipe for beaten biscuits says "Beat five hundred strokes with a mallet. This will take an hour or more but the biscuits are worth it." The home economists of the Consumer Section, Dominion Department of Agriculture say that the homemaker of today wants to serve hot breads with less effort than that, so they recommend the following recipes.

Butterscotch Crunch Coffee Muffins 1 1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour 1 2-3 cups sifted pastry flour Or 1 1-2 cups whole wheat flour 1/4 cup sugar 2 teaspoons baking powder 3-4 teaspoon salt 1 egg 1/2 cup milk 2 tablespoons mild-flavoured fat Sift together dry ingredients. Beat egg; add milk and shortening. Stir into dry ingredients, mix only enough to moisten flour. Pour into lightly greased muffin tins. Sprinkle with following topping. Bake in hot oven (400°F.) 25-30 minutes. Yield: 9 muffins.

POTATO SCONES 2 cups sifted all-purpose flour 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 cup mashed potatoes 4 teaspoons baking powder 3-4 cup milk 2 tablespoons melted fat Mix and sift dry ingredients. Blend with mashed potatoes, add milk and melted fat. Pat out to 1-inch thickness and cut in diamonds. Bake on a hot ungreased griddle. When well browned on one side, turn and cook on other side. Makes 12 scones.

Butterscotch Crunch Topping 1/4 tablespoon butter 1/4 cup brown sugar 1/2 tablespoon flour 1 tablespoon water 1 cup corn flakes Or wheat flakes Melt the butter and stir into it the combined sugar and flour. Add the water and cook over low heat, stirring to blend, for about 3 minutes. Quickly pour over the cereal mixing thoroughly. Spread in a shallow pan and cool. Sprinkle over muffins.
