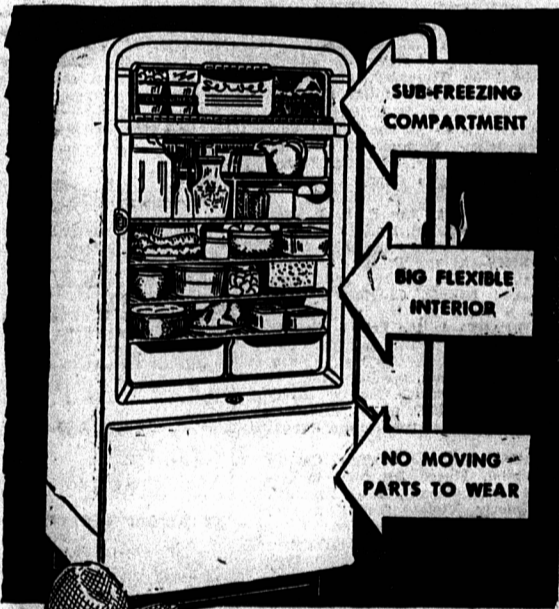

A. RUSSELL CLARK

With deep regret we record the death of A. Russell Clark, Cape Traverse in his 76th year, who passed away on Friday, April 1st. Although never of a robust nature it was not until a few weeks it became apparent the inevitable must happen.

The late Mr. Clark was born in Augustine Cove and when a young man moved with his parents to his grandfather's homestead in Cape Traverse, where he became one of the most successful farmers of the district.

In the home he was a devoted husband, loving father and companion to the family, and everywhere his kind and loving disposition was shown so much it was a pleasure to all to know him. In all that pertained to the welfare of mankind, he was ever and always ready to lend a helping hand and the community has lost one of its most respected citizens. A staunch member of the church of Scotland, in politics a Conservative.

Besides a large circle of friends there are left to cherish his memory his sorrowing widow (Nina Emma of Cape Traverse) two daughters and two sons Mrs. Earl Sawyer, Cape Traverse; Mrs. Everett Daniels, Tewksbury Mass.; Arthur and David of Charlottetown; one brother Isaac of Charlottetown and nine grandchildren.

The funeral was from his late residence on Monday April 4th, services being conducted by the Rev. Horace MacEwen of the

Church of Scotland and although the roads were almost impassable the large attendance at the house and at the grave bespeak the esteem in which the late Mr. Clark was held.
