PRESENTED BY DEWEY

To Aguinaldo—Silver Bland dead, Thirty Thousand Miners out.

MANILA, June 15—(Special)—General Otis telegraphs that the enemy in Wednesday's battle numbered 4,000 and they lost, in killed, wounded and captured more than one third.

Their artillery was guns captured from the Spaniards and presented to Aguinaldo by Admiral Dewey, and manned by Spanish prisoners.

LEBANON, Mo., June 15—(Special)—Hon. R. P. Bland died this morning. He was in Congress eleven terms as a Missouri representative and was author of the Silver Coinage bill known as the Bland Bill of 1878.
