ACCEPT CHALLENGE.—Mr. D.A. MacKinnon of this city has accepted the offer of Mr. Frank Redding to race Gladiola, 2:19 1/2 against Dr. Harper, 2:19 1/2 for \$500 a side. Gladiola was imported by Mr. Redding last fall. She took part in fourteen races in 1913 on the most prominent tracks of the middle west, winning a large amount of money. Mr. MacKinnon felt it necessary to accept the "defi" which appeared in dozens of papers in order to preserve the prestige of this province as a sporting centre. As the challenged party he will have the choice of tracks and will endeavor to have the race here if possible during Confederation week. An event of this kind should draw an immense crowd as both horses are famous in their respective provinces.

Mrs. Nan Estabrook, of St. John, is visiting in Charlottetown, the guest of Miss Marian Russ.

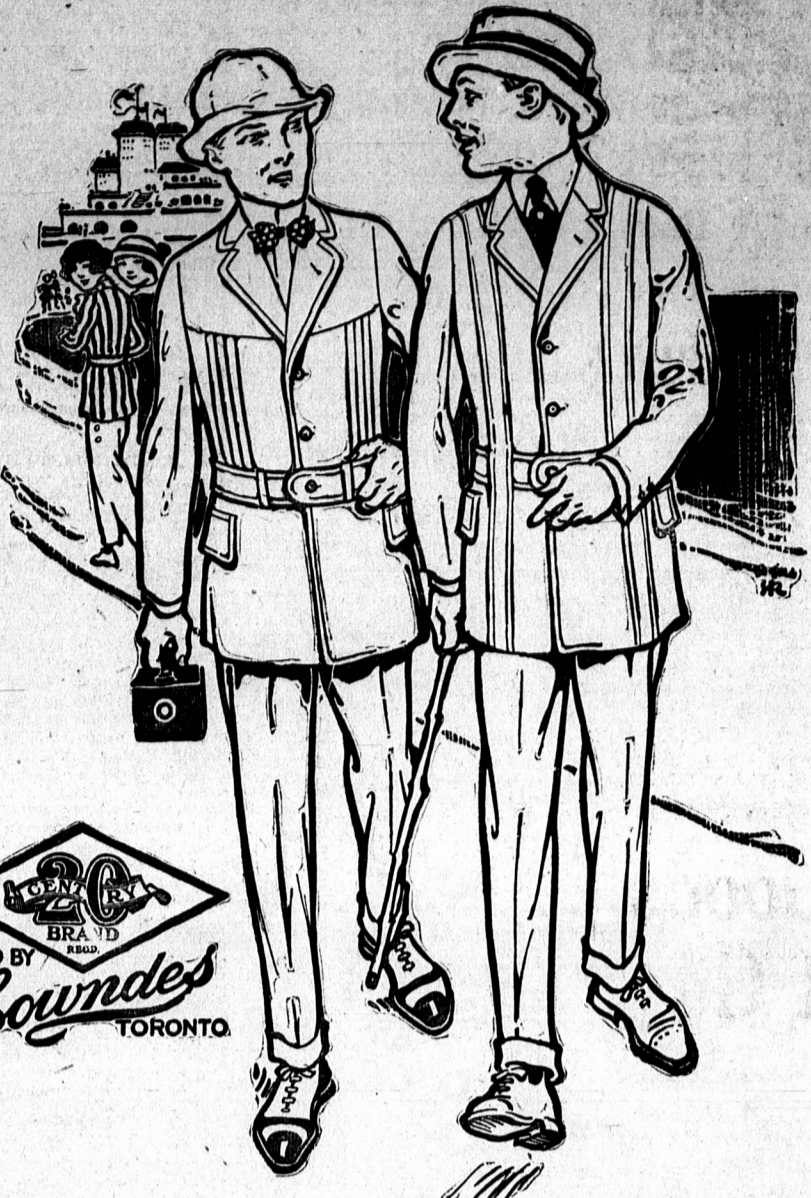
Dr. Ethick returned Saturday night from Summerside, where he went to confer with Dr. Higgins on veterinary matters.

Hon. J. E. Watt, Speaker of the Provincial Legislature, came to Charlottetown on Saturday night by the express.

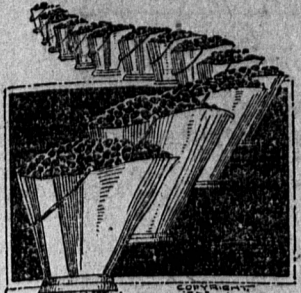
Miss B. Cardiner, daughter of Mr. George E. Gardiner, arrived in Charlottetown by the express on Saturday night on a visit to her home.
