SOME LEADING ANARCHISTS.

The most notorious Anarchist leaders in the United States at the present time, aside from the would-be assassin of the President are John Most and Emma Goldman, the latter now under arrest for having invited Czolgosz to commit his awful crime.

Most is a German, the proprietor and publisher of an Anarchist daily newspaper in New York called Die Freiheit. He will be remembered from his connection with the Hay Market dynamite outrages and murders years ago in Chicago and has been several times arrested for his threatening conduct and utterances. Even since the attempt to kill the President, Most has published some murderous articles in his newspaper. On the day following the shooting Die Freiheit contained an article justifying the killing of rulers, which concluded as follows:

"The greatest of all follies is to believe that it is criminal to commit any crime against a despot or his associates. This foolish belief is a crime in itself. . . . The despots, both republican and others declare murder immoral when it is not in their interests, but when it is in their interests it is different. A revolution is nothing else but a protest against poverty. Murder is the shape of war against poverty is not only allowed, but it is a duty. We say, Murder the Murderers! Save humanity through blood and iron, poison and dynamite. If we want to save humanity we must have murder."

Such are the doctrines now being disseminated in the chief city of the United States while the loved President lies in the shadow of death, struck down by the bullet of an Anarchist assassin. Most is not arrested, but is apparently to be allowed to continue his open apologies for, and glorification of the most appalling crime of the days in which we live. And the man who committed the murderous deed cannot, if the President lives be punished except by imprisonment, and that for a term not exceeding ten years. And if his conduct while in prison is unobjectionable, the term must be reduced to less than seven years on account of "good behavior."

Emma Goldman, from whom Czolgosz says he imbibed the impulse to kill President McKinley, is about thirty-five years of age, and is the daughter of a Russian tailor. She was brought up without education in a hotbed of Nihilism at Keona. Seventeen years ago she came to the United States and married a man by the name of Grunbaum. She deserted him after eighteen months and followed to New York a man by the name of Bernstein, a noted Anarchist. Since then she has had many partners in vice, being quite regardless of the marriage tie. In New York she assumed the name of Goldman and wrote signed articles for Most's newspaper. Then she quarrelled with Most, and at one

time publicly horsewhipped him. At one time she associated herself with an Anarchist group known as the Pioneers of Liberty, but her language was so violent that they expelled her. Later she joined the German Anarchists.

A man by the name of Berkman a paramour of Emma Goldman shot Henry C. Frick at the Carnegie works a few years ago. Since that both she and Berkman joined the extreme wing of the Anarchists. She has made her living by delivering incendiary addresses from city to city. She was arrested for inciting a riot in 1893 and spent a year in prison on Blackwell's Island. While in prison she began the study of medicine and took a degree after her release. Emma Goldman speaks several languages. Her addresses are described as being of the inflammatory kind, appealing to the worst passions of men, without logic or argument. Her usual tirade is a denunciation of capital, of rulers and of the laws of society. She has always, like Most, taught that murder of those who stand in the way of what she calls "liberty" is a duty.

Emma Goldman if now under arrest, but it is doubtful whether under the existing laws she can be made to suffer more than nominal punishment. In every sense of the word a bad woman, she is less dangerous to the nation than Most, who daily teaches anarchy and murder to the numerous readers of his incendiary newspaper. From the Canadian standpoint it would appear that in the case of the Anarchist leaders, liberty of speech and of the press has been allowed to degenerate into unbridled and most dangerous license which must here after be sternly checked. Stricter laws, severer penalties and more energetic administration of the code against criminals of the Most and Goldman stripe are imperatively necessary to the national safety.


