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Find Man Guilty of Indecent Assault

Alexander Richards of Kinkora was found guilty of indecent assault by a trial jury at Summerside on Saturday which deliberated forty eight minutes before bringing in its verdict. He had been charged with having carnal knowledge of a girl under fourteen years of age but the jury found him guilty of the lesser offence. The trial took four days to complete in the Supreme Court before Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell. Sentence was deferred till December 13th. In his charge to the jury Saturday afternoon Chief Justice Campbell told them that "there is not sufficient evidence to justify you convicting the accused of the offence charged of carnal knowledge, even of alleged carnal knowledge." He went on to explain, however, that a jury may convict not only of the offence charged but may convict of any lesser offence included in the offence charged. It is clear, he explained, that carnal knowledge of a girl under this age includes the offence of indecent assault of a girl under fourteen. "There is in this case," he said, "sufficient evidence in law to justify you in convicting the accused of indecent assault."
