THE NEW YORK ELECTIONS.

The civic elections in Greater New York will take place tomorrow and a great deal of interest centres in the efforts to crush Boss Croker and Tammany Hall. Croker has hurried back from England to take command of his forces. He has to a large extent effected a fusion of interests between the regular Democratic organization and Tammany and set up a gentleman named Shepard as their candidate for Mayor. Shepard was not long ago engaged in a vigorous crusade against Tammany, but the Democracy have now apparently accepted the notion of "taming the tiger" after first giving him a new lease of life.

Nearly the entire press of New York stands opposed to Tammany, but the Journal supports Shepard's candidature on the ground that if elected he will reform the notorious abuses which have been long rampant. The opposition to Tammany consists of a fusion ticket of Republicans, Social Reformers and nearly every respectable organization in New York, with Seth Low as candidate for Mayor. Tammany has unlimited money for the fight, one corporation alone, with a profitable civic contract, having contributed \$100,000 to the campaign funds. The battle will be a tremendous one, and enormous sums have been betted on the result with some odds in favor of Shepard and Tammany. The result, is, of course in doubt, but millions of honest, order-loving citizens will be rejoiced if Tammany should be defeated.

Some of the English newspaper correspondents who accompanied the Duke and Duchess through Canada, and who made an occasional side trip into the States were more favorably impressed with the looks and manners of the Dominion people than their neighbors. Thus the Morning Post correspondent writes:

"Some of us crossed to Buffalo to see the exposition, which was disappointing. Buffalo is a slovenly-looking, if prosperous city in great contrast with the handsome Canadian cities we had recently visited.

"All the correspondents noted the extraordinary difference in the aspect and manners of the people here and across the border.

"We appeared to have suddenly got out of a region of wholesome, fresh-complexioned people into a land of a meager pallid race like one sees in some of our manufacturing cities, an active, brisk people, lacking the courteous manner of the Canadians."

France has an enormously heavy national debt, and this year there is a deficit of \$10,000,000 on ordinary account.
