Brooklyn Dodgers Hold First Place In National League, Reds Second

Yanks Down Senators In 5-0 Encounter

NEW YORK, May 27 (AP)—The Yankees and Washington Senators matched four hits today, but the world champions made their good for a 5-0 American League victory in their fourth in the last five games.

Spud Chandler, the youthful right-hander, never was better than today. He allowed only scattered singles and gave but one walk in achieving his second triumph against three losses.

In contrast, Charley Keller and Lefty Ken Chase walked four consecutive batters for a run in the third.

Chicago White Sox, whose winning streak had been interrupted by a loss to Detroit Saturday, regained their victorious ways—and both came through in the sixth inning when Chicago ganged up to score four runs and drive Jack Kramer from the box. Lefty Wright's angle with the bases loaded tallied two of the runs.

NEW YORK, May 27 (AP)—Brooklyn Dodgers held first place in the National League by four percentage points, shutting out Philadelphia Phillies 6-0 today on the four-hit hurling of Whitlow Wyatt. Cincinnati took a doubleheader from Pittsburgh but the Reds still were second with a 710 percentage to Brooklyn's 714.

Peewee Reese and Dixie Walker, each with three hits, led a 12-hit Brooklyn assault concentrated in the fifth inning against Clyde Snee. The Dodgers put together five consecutive hits off the Philly southpaw for three runs and in the seventh scored two more with a single and two doubles off Frank Herr.

Boston Bees, who hadn't beaten New York Giants in seven tries this season, accomplished the trick easily 7-1, on a four-hit pitching performance by Bill Fosdel and 13 hit offense.

Tony Cucinello had a perfect day at the plate with two doubles and two singles to lead the attack.

Chicago Cubs opened a 14-game home stand with a 7-1 victory over St. Louis Cardinals behind the seven-hit pitching of Claude Passeau.

The game, played in intermittent showers, was Passeau's third victory against four defeats.

Cincinnati Reds won twice over the last place Pittsburgh Pirates. The scores were 7-1 and 7-3.

After getting off to an unsteady start in the first game, Mace Brown pitched masterly ball for the Pirates, allowing only two hits in the final three innings.

Jim Turner travelled the full distance for the Reds in the nightcap, holding the Pirates to nine hits.

Starting Gate Adds Woodbine To Successes

12-STALL STEEL GET-AWAY MACHINE PLEASES EASTERN TRACK OFFICIAL AT RE-OPENING.

TORONTO, May 27 (CP)—The Puett racing gate, a far cry from the walk-up start of early turf days, made its eastern Canada debut this spring. So far there has been general approval of the stream-lined 12-stall contraption.

Thomas (Nipper) Rowe, official starter for the Incorporated Canadian Racing Association, summed up the consensus after the gate was used at Woodbine Park. "It's the best gate on any circuit," he said.

He made that statement after he had pulled a "boner" at the start of the 81st running of the King's Plate. Ring Wise was left at the post even though the gate is designed to eliminate such happenings. The fault rested on Rowe, however. He neglected to make sure Ring Wise was locked properly in the stall.

After the horses are placed in the stall a heavy bar is dropped in slots at the rear, preventing the horses from backing out. Double doors at the front fit together in a v-shape.

An assistant starter did not fit the rear bar properly and as Rowe pressed the button releasing the front gates, Ring Wise backed from the stall.

Vancover tracks, des. des. the gate last year and tried it out at Lansdowne Park. Other Vancover tracks also used it. Then Alred G. Handbert decided to give the gate a trial at Pimlico Park. It was in big-time to stay.

Used in Other Parts
Hialeah and Tropical parks used the gate during the winter and then Jamaica, Belmont, Empire, Saratoga, Santa Anita, Agua Caliente, Arlington, Washington and Detroit installed it.

The gate, however, hasn't gained the same popularity in Canada. So far Vancover tracks and tracks under the Incorporated racing association in Eastern Canada are the only ones which will use it this year.

On the Prairies two gates will be tried. Edmonton, Calgary, Regina and Saskatoon will use the Cowell gate. It was designed by Mark Cowell, western Canadian trainer, and is similar to the Puett Gate. The Metropolitan Racing Association, operators of Long Branch and Dufferin Park in Toronto, will also use the Cowell gate.

Whitler and Polo Park in Winnipeg will use the Improved Speers' Gate. It was designed by R. J. Speers, honorary secretary of the Prairie Thoroughbred Breeders and racing association.

The gate is featured by stalls which jut forward from the superstructure, leaving horses without obstruction and giving the starter a clear view of the field.

In Quebec, the Quebec Racing Association will continue to use the Cattarmich Gate, a 10-stall affair. It will be used at Connaught, Dorval, Blue Bonnets and Mount Royal.

MONTREAL, May 27 (CP)—Montreal Royals handed Toronto Maple Leafs their third successive setback here today 5-4, sinking the Leafs deeper in the International Baseball League cellar.

The win, which gave Royals a sweep of the three-game series, was captured on the strength of some fine relief hurling by Red Lucas, veteran right-hander who saw long service with Cincinnati and Pittsburgh.

Lucas gave five hits after taking over from Bob Porter with one out in the first and gained his first win of the season, though he had to be rescued by Bill Crouch in the eighth.

The only other game scheduled, Syracuse at Newark, was rained out.

Bellouse weighed 146 1-4; Luffspring, 147 1-2.

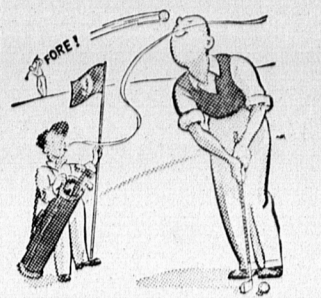

The SNAPSHOT GUILD PICTURES AT BLOSSOM TIME



Spring blossoms make an excellent setting for pictures. At blossom-time, get snaps of this sort, as well as close-ups of the blossoms themselves.

SPRING blossoms are an invitation to any camera owner, for their delicacy and freshness give them a natural appeal as picture subjects. However, to take really good blossom pictures, there are several rules you must observe.

The first rule is: get close. Don't stand away back, and picture a whole tree or a whole orchard in every shot. Take one or two general shots—then move in for close-ups of the blooms. If you're using a fixed-focus camera, or one with limited focusing range, use a portrait attachment on the lens—this will enable you to get even closer.

If you have access to a camera of the double extension bellows type, use that for blossom pictures. With such a camera, you can shoot blossoms in their actual size—filling the film with two or three blooms.

Choose blossoms that are properly lighted, so that the contrast of sunshine and shadow emphasizes the form of the subject. Don't let

color sway you, unless you are using full-color film. For black-and-white shots, especially of pink blossoms, a fine-grain panchromatic film is best.

If you shoot a group of blossoms outlined against a blue sky—and this is a very good type of blossom picture—slip a color filter on the camera lens. The filter will darken the sky, making the blossoms stand out fresh and white. To obtain a deep-toned sky, use a deep yellow G filter. For a lighter sky tone, a medium yellow K-2 filter is the one to choose.

Blossoms make an excellent setting for pictures of people—informal-portrait snapshots with a fresh, springtime quality. Make a collection of such shots during blossom time, showing members of the family visiting an orchard, admiring the blooms, and sniffing their fragrance. You'll find many an interesting picture opportunity—and these blossom-time pictures will be welcome in your album.

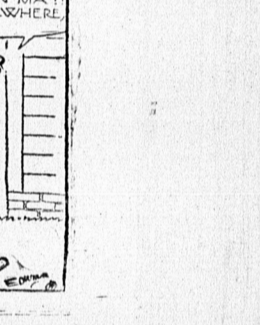
