INTERESTING POINTERS FOR ALL TO READ

The issuing of New Wonderland Pointers—during the past week was rather a revelation to those who are given the additional expense, is of the opinion that the picture business consists of putting up a picture machine—turning on the lights—and letting the performance go on. That staff numbering what New Wonderland's management employs was in the people, rented as it is by one of attendance, was news to many. And as a little additional information, it might be well to consider just what the expense incident of running a Picture house properly is. And then again it is well to keep in mind that this picture house employs some help—leaves its money right in the city, the only amount going away being film rental.

First there is a very large Hall rental paid—the largest considering the population of the city and of the inability to run matinees of any kind in Canada. Then there is heat—and the sum asked for heating the Market Hall is an item to be considered when the returns have to be made from five cent admissions.

Then there are the salaries of operators, singers, pianists, ushers, doo keepers, ticket sellers, janitress—express charges, transportation of singers, etc. It is a big undertaking, and one which from a casual standpoint seems to be an easy money getting scheme, but one which in reality demands thought, carefulness, and good

management in every detail to make things right. When extra attractions are given the additional expense is much greater, and it is only fair to consider in view of the facts above mentioned, and which may appear as news to many, that New Wonderland, belonging as it does to the people, rented as it is by one of the best people, is an institution that deserves all the encouragement possible, and that the citizens should stand by it in the future as they have done since the present management took it in hand.

A great item of expense in the business of New Wonderland is the Film Service—which costs almost a hundred dollars each week, for it is the finest and best supplied by the Kinetograph, the best film supply in Canada.

Comparing New Wonderland with the hall as it was originally and during previous managements, it is difficult to recognize it as the same place, and all the cleaning and scrubbing of same costs money, but it is only an instance of what perseverance and hard work will do when there are difficulties to face.
