ROOSEVELT REJECTS MAKING COMPROMISE WITH REPUBLICANS.

NEW YORK, Feb. 14.—Theodore Roosevelt reiterated here his declaration of no compromise between the Republicans and Progressives. In a speech before the National Progressive Club, he declared that the party has come to stay.

At the annual meeting of the Lincoln Club of Boston at the American House, State Treasurer Elmer A. Stevens declared that "the Republican party has had its knocks before, and has come back, and it is going to come back again."

DOW BOOKS ARE PUT IN AS EVIDENCE.

BOSTON, Feb. 15.—Considerable time was taken up today at the opening of the Stephen R. Dow trial before Judge Brown in the Suffolk superior court, in the placing in evidence by the government attorneys of the ledger and cash books and directors' meetings of the Indiana Mining Company, North Lake Mining Company, Franklin Mining Company and Algoma Mining Company, all of which Dow was president, and from which he is accused by the government of stealing large sums of money.

The putting in evidence of these books and records occupied the first half-hour of the trial today. Asst.-Dist.-Atty. Webber conducted the government's case.

When the books had all been placed in evidence, Alvin R. Bailey, secretary and treasurer of the four companies and former confidential clerk to Dow, resumed the stand to continue the testimony broken off by the adjournment of the court last night.

In answer to questions by the assistant district attorney, Bailey told how Dow had raised large sums of money in the form of loans for which he gave unsecured notes and no collateral.
