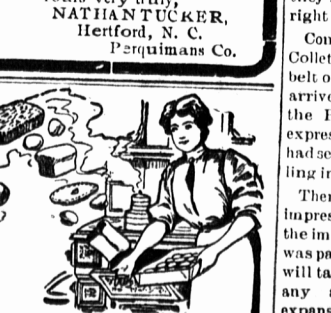

### THOUGHTFUL OPINION ON THE NORTH WEST

Interview With W. C. Collett, Who Has Carefully Studied The North West--The Problem of San Francisco--The Land Boom in Edmonton

W. C. Collett, a Prince Edward Islander, who has been established on Bromfield Street, Boston, for a number of years, as a successful architect, recently undertook an extended tour to the Pacific Coast.

His route west was by way of Chicago, Denver, Salt Lake City, and intermediate cities to San Francisco—a most interesting trip which furnished him with plenty of subjects of study. Some time was spent in San Francisco, going over the ruins. Mr. Collett is of the opinion that the prospects of San Francisco being rebuilt, as quickly as first reports after the earthquake indicated, are not likely to be fulfilled. There are several reasons for this: in the first place the insurance companies are slow to pay their losses and maintain that they should not be liable for injuries caused by the earthquake; furthermore the people were not by any means so much insured as one would have supposed considering the risk of earthquake, and also because the women by a great majority are too nervous to again take up living in houses. At the time Mr. Collett visited the city many of them were carrying on their housekeeping in tents. There has been a large exodus from the stricken city, and no doubt many more will leave when they have been tired out by the insurance companies and forced to take what they will pay them.

Seattle appears to have benefited by San Francisco's misfortune. For that matter however, it has been evident for years past that Seattle has been usurping San Francisco's place as the premier port of the Pacific Coast. There is no doubt, Mr. Collett thinks, that Seattle, with a country round about abounding in the riches of the earth to an unusual degree, is bound to rank among the greatest seaports of the world in time to come.

From Seattle, Mr. Collett went to Victoria, a city which he found very beautiful, very English, very conservative and well satisfied, and not apparently anxious to shine as one of the phenomenon cities of the growing west. Vancouver, he thought was a little more enterprising, but lacking in "hustle" and decidedly slow in availing itself of natural resources lying undeveloped at its very doors. For instance, bricks are imported at an extravagant price when they might be manufactured at a profit right on the spot.

Coming east from Vancouver Mr. Collett was struck with the cultivatable belt of land traversed until the train arrived at Slocan Junction. Through the Rockies the scenery was beyond expression grand—surpassing all that he had seen in the course of extensive travelling in both hemispheres.

Then the track came to a prairie, impressing the traveller with a sense of the immensity of the great Dominion. He was particularly struck by the fact that it will take many millions of people to make any appreciable sign that this vast expanse is at all populated. All those who have already arrived are but a mere sprinkling of settlers, hardly to be noticed in the immensity of their surroundings.

The land between the Rockies and Calgary he thought to be of a quality inferior to that of many Prince Edward Island farms. Of course in much of the North-west the land is of wonderful richness, but his observation informed him that the land was not all of the best quality. Then the terrible loneliness of the life of new settlers forced itself upon him; the lack of society; the need of churches; the roughness of the life, etc., all factors that led him to think it were wise for men well off or even comfortable in another country to defer moving to the great west. For a young man with a fairly large amount of capital, well and good; in years to come if all went well he

would likely prosper but much hard work lies before such, and many discomforts. It is now getting very hard to procure the best land, for of late years speculators have bought it in large tracts and hold it for profit.

Winnipeg struck Mr. Collett as being the most go-ahead of the Canadian Cities. It is a hustling, lively place, with much business doing.

Edmonton he found in the throes of a land boom, of which he spoke very freely. An Englishman who had come to Edmonton to invest informed him that land was bought one day, for a certain price from a real estate agent. Next day it was sold back to the first man for an increased price; and again it would change hands at a higher figure. These "wash" sales impressed tender feet and they rushed in to get a good thing which often turned out to be not so good as they had expected.

Altogether he thought the question of "going West" was one that deserved much careful consideration, he was very emphatic in his opinion that if men in Prince Edward Island worked as hard as men on the prairies are forced to work they would live a far happier life and make more money.
