**Potato Steamer At Georgetown**

The Danish freighter, Gladys Dan, arrived in Georgetown from Summerside yesterday morning to complete loading a cargo of seed potatoes for Norfolk, Va. Loading operations began shortly after the ship was brought alongside the dock at 8.30. It is expected the 35 to 40 cars required to complete loading will be aboard by this evening.

Most of the potatoes at Georgetown are being put aboard by the Associated Shippers, with the P.E.-I. Potato Growers supplying a smaller amount.

The Gladys Dan, which carries a crew of 35 officers and men, is a two-year old ship, and is described as one of the most modern to enter Georgetown. Oil is burned under the boilers.

The freighter was piloted in by Temple Gottell and his assistant, Victor Ratuse.

Some 51,084 bags of the ship's 65,000 bag cargo was put aboard at Summerside. It was learned. The ship is registered at 4,437 tons gross, 2,377 net.

**Georgetown and Vicinity**

The painting and re-decorating of the interior of St. James Church by Mr. John Murphy, well known painter of the capital, is well advanced. The usual excellence of Mr. Murphy's work is strikingly illustrated and the whole church presents a very beautiful and artistic appearance, done in pastel shades, with the ceiling tinted in light blue and white. The organ is finished in mahogany and bronze with the altars and communion rail in marble and gold leaf. The statues and stations have been repainted. Radiators throughout the church are finished in gold.

**Brant County's Contribution**

"The junior farmers of Brant County, in keeping with modern trends, put on a demonstration to see how capable tractor operators were, in driving their machines through a maze of twists and turns and difficult tests. It was rather amazing to note the number of visitors who came to complete the tests satisfactorily. One of the largest tents housed the products of Brant County. There was a magnificent display of garden products, an extensive apple exhibit, a seed show, sponsored by the Boy Scouts Club, Brant fuel, tobacco, Brant eggs, textiles, milk products, canned fruit and vegetables. Another tent was filled with historic relics of Indian and pioneer days.

"It was agreed by all that the men from Brant County did a very difficult job to improve on the site selected, parking and billeting were satisfactorily conducted; they had an outstanding display of live stock in another tent, with many grand champions from other shows, representing the Huron, Grey, and Guernsey, Jersey and dual purpose Shorthorns. They had representatives of the leading breeds of sheep and some outstanding Yorkshire swine from the Tempair herd, established by the famous "Uncle Joe" Brethour.

LONDON, Nov. 21 (Reuters)—A 12-year-old Middlesex schoolboy, George Edward Crick, was acquitted on a charge of murdering a four-year-old boy. "For the first time in 22 years the International Ploughing Match ran into a spell of bad weather that cancelled ploughing events for one day, so that the championship contests were carried out on Saturday instead of Friday. Thursday and the rest of the week were ideal days, and the loamy soil, with its gravelly subsoil, was soon dry enough to suit the ploughmen.

"This great International Ploughing Match was concluded with a banquet and the awarding of prizes on Saturday night, in a giant hanger at the Burford airport, where 11,000 people gathered to feast and applaud their favorite winners."
