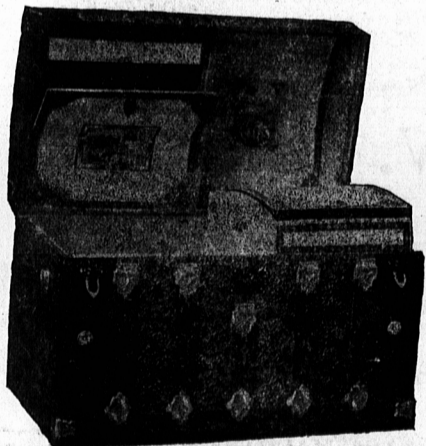

McLEAN, Mr. Herbert and Rev. J. McDougall returned last night from Pictou where they were attending the meeting of the Presbytery of the Church of Scotland at which Rev. W. J. Campbell was ordained. A REMINDER of the approach of winter is found in the fact that on Monday next the winter time table on the Intercolonial will go into effect. Fourteen trains used in the summer service will be dropped, including the Ocean Limited and the train between St. John and Point du Chene known as the Boston express.
