Lenten Meditations

THE MEASURE OF FAITH

If there is such a thing as current coin in the realm of heaven it is faith. If one would have commerce with heavenly wages one must first produce faith. Faith makes us heirs of salvation; faith is the basic element in all Christian experience; faith brings to us any victory we ever gain in holiness of life.

In every age there have stood out on the pages of human history men and women who have astonished their contemporaries by the largeness of the measure of their faith. In the halls of one of the colleges in the eastern states there stands a reproduction in actual size of Michael Angelo's statue of Moses. As one gazes on that stately figure with its massive brow, about which the thunderings of Sinai still seem to reverberate, this giant of faith seems separated from the rest of the human race. What grandeur of faith was his whose broad shoulders carried the weight of the whole Hebrew people! In the eleventh chapter of the Epistle to the Hebrews we have a wondrous portrait gallery of the heroes and heroines who have wrought wonderful exploits for God by their faith.

Whilst in all these cases it might appear that these leaders in faith were set apart from the rest of mankind, yet we have reason to believe that they were not the children of special privilege and God gives to every one of us a measure of faith by which we too may be victors in the fight. Faith is the foundation of peace. The Psalmist declares that God will keep in perfect peace the soul that trusts Him. Faith is the keystone of courage. The future may seem ambushed with foes at every turn in the road; but "The Lord is my light and my salvation; of whom shall I be afraid."

The Apostle Paul refers to every man as having received from God's hands "the measure of faith"; and since faith means so much, it is important to ask how this measure of faith can be increased. In the affairs of the world faith grows in its proper atmosphere. Even one man, by his own faith, will lift a whole people out of their doubt and unbelief to trust and confidence. In mundane affairs, it is often impossible to fail to have faith in some object, because of the faith of others. Even so with Christian faith.

Chief Justice McRuer Held Conference Here on Children Fund Work

Chief Justice J. C. McRuer, of the Supreme Court of Ontario, and President of the Canadian Bar Association in Canada, who visited Charlottetown last week, is also President of the Canadian Save the Children Fund. During Chief Justice McRuer's visit he had a conference with Mr. J. O. Hyndman, who is the Island representative on the executive council. The Canadian Save the Children Fund is successor of the Canadian Committee of the Save the Children Fund of Great Britain founded in 1922. It is the intention to form a committee or branch of the new Canadian organization in each Province, and it is expected that Prince Edward Island will come to Prince Edward Island in the near future.

Hunger is the cause of the incredible sights of destruction and fear, chaos and apathy everywhere evident in Europe today. Mrs. Margit Levinson, Swedish Save the Children president, in her report before the Save the Children Federation of New York stated: "I don't think anything effective can be done towards rehabilitating Europe and educating its people until they have been fed—until they can satisfy the most elementary requirement—that is, to procure food for their children."

The Save the Children Fund is an international organization, formed to help children, regardless of race, creed or colour, in any country of the world where children are in need. There are at present over 100 trained Save the Children Fund workers in the war stricken countries of Europe, doing their utmost to relieve child sufferers. The citizens of Prince Edward Island have been most generous in their voluntary support of the Fund during the war and since. Mr. J. O. Hyndman, who has been associated with the organization for the past twenty-five years, has agreed to carry on, until a Provincial Committee can be formed.
