TORONTO, April 11.—The directors of the Canada Woolen Mills today decided to close the business and sell out the plants at Hespeler, Carleton Place, Waterloo and Lambton Mills. Seven hundred hands are employed, but the directors say they are running only four days a week to unprofitable business.
