Place Remains of Sir Wilfrid in New Vault

OTTAWA, Sept. 28.—With simple, dignified ceremony attended only by a few former friends, the remains of Sir Wilfrid Laurier were Monday afternoon removed from their resting place in Notre Dame Cemetery to a vault which has been built under the spot where a beautiful monument will shortly be placed to his memory. The new grave is in the most central and picturesque spot in the cemetery, a fitting resting place for the remains of so illustrious a leader.

Only a half dozen persons were present when the bronze casket was lifted from the grave and placed in the special vault. Mr. Justice Brodeur represented the family and the state; Mr. H. B. McGavin, K. C., Mr. J. M. P., was present on behalf of the committee arranging for the memorial; Messrs E. R. E. Chevrier, M. P., Dr. J. E. Fontaine, M. P., and H. A. Fortier, M. P., for the Liberal party, and Mr. George Hignerty for the Ottawa Reform Association, Rev. Fat Louis Lejeune, O. M. I., parish priest of Sacred Heart Church, officiated at the consecration and blessing of the new grave. As Mr. Robert Laurier, nephew of Sir Wilfrid, was at Arthabaska attending the unveiling of a memorial to Sir Wilfrid he was unable to be present.

The new grave is circular in shape and surrounded by stately columns. The vault has been built beneath the level of the plot and will form the foundation for the monument. The remains of Lady Laurier will be placed beside those of her husband within a few days. It is not expected that the monument will be ready for unveiling this year. Several delays have been met with in securing the finished stone from France where it is being carved. Elaborate plans are being made for this ceremony.
