committees without consulting him. He had been appointed on the Special Committee as it was supposed to be considered he was best fitted to judge of the capacity of the various members of the Opposition. He referred especially to the constitution of the Committee on Public Accounts and said there were certain matters concerning the expenditures of the Government which he considered should be enquired into. He considered it was important to have on the Committee men who were accustomed to dealing with the finances of the country and there was no one who was in a better way of knowing of the capabilities of those men than he himself. He therefore moved that they should strike out the names of Mr. A. C. Saunders, J. D. McInnis and Mr. H. D. McEwen and substitute those of Messrs J. H. Bell, George E. Hughes and J. J. Johnston.

The Premier said he was not at all disposed to deal severely with the Leader of the Opposition in his first break since he assumed office, but he would like to point out for his information that neither Mr. Bell nor himself, nor anyone else had a right to be upon any committee. If Mr. Bell thought so he forgot his place and the place of every person holding any office or position in the House. If the House decided to put Mr. Bell on a committee it might do so, but the House decided it had some other use to which it could put the services of that honourable gentleman, why, the House could dispense with his services on the Public Accounts Committee or any other committee. His complaint was one which he had heard made by new members in the House before, and it was made in the face of a practice that had existed in the House since time immemorial. He challenged the hon. member to point to one single instance in the history of this Legislature when a course different in principle from the one now pursued had been taken. The majority of the committee, he pointed out, brought a report into the House. Did the hon. member think he was going to control the committee? If the Leader of the Opposition had only considered what the practice of the House was he would have brought in his minority report and the two would have been submitted to the House. In view of the fact that the Leader of the Opposition had not been in the House for many years, he was not disposed to ask that the irregular report made by him should be struck out, but he was quite satisfied it should be taken in lieu of a minority report. where a committee was not unanimous a report was brought in by a majority and a minority, and they had never yet heard the minority complain that they could not control the result of the deliberations of the committee. His learned friend opposite must learn that although he occupied an exceedingly important position, he could not expect right off-hand to control the whole action of the House and say he insisted that he should be here or there, or that the House should be compelled to put him upon this or that committee. In selecting the committee they considered that the member for the second district of Prince George was just as competent as any other person that could be chosen. He did not think that for ability or integrity or on any other ground, Mr. Bell could say that the members nominated by the majority were not just as fit to occupy their places on the committee as those who had been chosen. Whoever might have made the selection, in the end it was not the majority of the committee or the minority, but the House itself by its vote, that would determine the matter. He did not think that the attack by the Leader of the Opposition argued well for the advantageous consideration of the public affairs of the province at the present session, and perhaps, as this was only the beginning, the hon. gentleman might change his methods. George E. Hughes seconded the motion of Mr. Bell for the substitution of names on the Public Accounts Committee. He said it was important that the Public Accounts should be investigated, and he was informed that he had been no report on the public accounts during the last four years. He was sure that the Leader of the Opposition should oppose the motion to have three members of the Opposition on the Committee. He thought that in fairness to the public the fullest investigation should be held. He was not anxious to be a member of the Committee, but he thought the Leader of the Government might acquiesce in the request to allow three of the Opposition to act on the Committee. Hon. A. E. Arsenault said that in constituting the committee the very same procedure had been followed as for years past. The hon. member for West River would remember that some years ago the Opposition made the same complaint when he was a member of the Government; and it might not surprise the House to hear that when the Opposition asked for the same thing (Mr. Hughes) was one of those who turned it down. The excuse given then was that the procedure adopted was that which had been followed for a great many years past. What objection, therefore, could there be to the committee on the present occasion? He did not see that there could be any objection to the members of the Committee on the grounds of ability. He could assure the committee that they would have the fullest opportunity for investigation. Mr. McInnis supported the motion of Mr. Bell, adding that he thought he could give way to others in the Opposition who were more capable of dealing with financial matters than himself. The Premier said it would be well if the Leader of the Opposition would undertake to comply with the practice and submit a minority report. Mr. Bell, in accordance with this suggestion, then submitted a minority report, substituting in place of the names of Messrs Paton, McLellan and McNevin on the Public Accounts Committee, those of Messrs J. H. Bell, George E. Hughes and J. J. Johnston, and moved that the said report be concurred in. A standing vote was taken on the motion, which was defeated in the proportion of 16 to 13. The original motion of the Premier, that the report of the Special Committee be adopted, was next put to the vote and carried in the same proportion.
