DECIDE TO (Continued from Page 1) September 16th and 17th. The president read a communication from the secretary of the Charlottetown Board of Trade to the effect that this year the Province of P. E. I. has the privilege of nominating a president for the Maritime Board of Trade at the annual meeting. Mr. Hickey felt that the privilege should be taken advantage of. Mr. L. R. Allen was the unanimous choice of the local board as president elect. Other Business: Reporting for the publicity and tourist committee Mr. Alan Houman submitted a brief report and stated that a Summerside sign had been placed at Borden. From personal observation he believed that the tourist business in this Province had been very good during the past summer in comparison to the rest of the Maritimes. The president advised that he had received a communication from C.N.R. Superintendent Montgomery, Charlottetown, that the double ferry service would be operated on Labor Day to take care of the expected increase in tourist traffic. Considerable indignation was expressed by the Board when informed by Mr. George Hogg that a tourist party bound for Prince Edward Island had been informed by the officials at Atlantic Information Bureau that there was an accommodation to be had in Summerside and that they had better go to Charlottetown instead. In this particular instance the tourist had nevertheless come to Summerside and had no difficulty whatever in finding a place to stay. Full particulars of this incident, dates, etc., were to be obtained by the president who stated he would confer with Col. Reid in Charlottetown regarding this apparent discrimination.
