After meeting yesterday and today in separate get-togethers, the two leagues convened in commission-ers K. M. Landis's guidance tomorrow in joint session.

Sticks were being carried high and elbows came into frequent use as the teams continued turning on the pressure, but the only score came when the Rangers in the dying minutes of the period, twice in the opening minutes of the final session Beavers played short-handed to give Rangers a chance to pile in.

As stated before, the game was bristling and crammed full of speed throughout Beavers fast and tricky at times made the locals look bad but it was only at times. The pair were hardly seated on the ice and Beavers were trying hard all the time—fans can be sure of seeing one of the best senior teams to represent Charlottetown in the last few years.

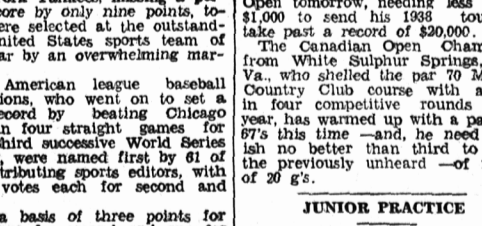

NEW YORK, Dec. 14 (AP)—New York Yankees, missing a perfect score by only nine points, today were selected at the outstanding United States sports team of the year by an overwhelming margin.

The American league baseball champions, who went on to set a new record by beating Chicago Cubs in four straight games for their third successive World Series victory, were named first by 61 of 67 contributing sports editors, with three votes each for second and third.

On a basis of three points for first, two for second and one for third, this gave the Bronx Bombers 192 points out of a possible 201.
