The annual meeting of the congregation of St. David's Presbyterian Church, Georgetown, on the 12th inst. was held on Monday evening, Jan. 9th. Although the evening was stormy quite a large number of the members and adherents of the congregation were present. The different reports showed a marked improvement along all branches of church work. The financial report showed a very large increase, retelling the snug sum of \$1,398.00, of which \$1,345.00 was raised during the year, being double the amount of the previous year, and largely in excess of any amount ever raised in one year in the history of the congregation. After giving twice as much as ever before to the schemes of the church, and after deducting expenditure for the year, a neat balance of nearly \$50.00 remains on the right side. When it is considered that this is the first year that this congregation ever attempted to give as much as ever, previously receiving \$200.00 from the congregation, and also that there are but 55 families in connection with the congregation, the showing is a creditable one indeed. The meeting voluntarily and unanimously decided to raise the minister's salary to the sum of \$550.00 and a manse. During the present pastorate of one year and two months the manse and church property have undergone a needed and thorough renovating at the cost of \$350.00, all of which has been paid, and not a dollar of debt remains on the property. The congregation has been enabled to do this, simply and easily, through the only sensible method of

church financing—"the weekly envelope system"—in this case the envelope for all purposes going into the one envelope. The congregation enters on the new year with renewed courage and with good prospects of making 1911 the best year yet.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties: Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$10 per acre.

Duties: Must reside upon the homestead or pre-empted six months in each six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn homesteaded patent and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain approval may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Pre-empted pre-empting. Must reside six months per acre. Duties: Must cultivate fifty acres per acre a house worth \$1000.

SOLD SOUL FOR DYING MATE.

PHILADELPHIA, Penn., Jan. 8.—Mrs. Louisa Cahn, for several years a member of one of the Presbyterian churches here asserted in police court that she had "sold her soul" in order to support her husband, who is in the fast stages of tuberculosis, and her two small children.

When she was arraigned before Magistrate Scott, Policeman Ribbel of the local "vice squad" said the woman's record was extremely bad. When asked if she could refute the testimony she said: "Until seven months ago I was a good church member. Then my husband was taken sick and the physicians said he had 'quick consumption.' I applied to my church friends to find me a position and they all said they would do their best. I waited for weeks. I answered all advertisements in the local newspapers. I did everything, but without result.

"As the only solution to the problem of living I sold myself. I did it because I wanted my husband with his children. I knew he did not have long to live, and I was satisfied to go to hell if I could make his last moments comfortable."

Magistrate Scott ordered the police to investigate her story. Detectives were put on the case and within an hour it had been established that she was telling the truth. The magistrate and the court attaches made up a purse for the woman.
