

DISCUSSION ON QUEUE CUTTING

If Order is Adhered to Voting List is Much Lowered

PERKIN, Dec. 12 (Special)—Quite a heated discussion took place in the National Council the other day on the Bill for compulsory queue cutting. The second Article of the Bill provides that those who wear queues are to be suspended from enjoying their public rights. In view of the approaching elections for the National Assembly this would have meant that a large number of persons otherwise qualified to appear upon the list of electors would have been deprived of their right to vote. As has been the case in many recent Bills, Mongolians and Tibetans were to be specially exempted from its operation. The absurdity of making the style of hair-dressing a qualification for the vote appears to have occurred to many of the members of the Council, but no definite decision had been arrived at when the sitting came to an end. On the following day the President issued a mandate revoking the order of the Shantung Tuth, which deprived all who wear queues of their civil rights, but at the same time stating that it is the duty of provincial officials to encourage the people to discard their queues, and to adopt and enforce measures according to circumstances.

ODESSA, Dec. 12 (Special)—One of the leading members of the Russian Sugar Trust, L. I. Brodski, of Kiev, has sold his refinery to a syndicate of Russian and French bankers for \$20,000,000. M. Brodski retains 20 per cent. of the shares of the newly-constructed company. The vendor is a millionaire Jew, who, in consequence of the increased Jewish disabilities in the Ukraine capital, has elected to transfer his permanent residence to Paris. The new syndicate hopes to profit largely by the increased Russian sugar exports to Western Europe, and more especially to the United Kingdom.

Although women in the Canton Province were, by order of the Tung Mong Hui (Dr. Sun Yat Sen's party), allowed to vote for the Provincial Assembly at Canton when it was formed upon the ruins of the Manchu regime, they will be debarred from exercising this privilege next January, as women suffrage was not granted by the provisional Convention.

LONDON, Dec. 12 (Special)—Mrs. Louis Lataur, who delivered a lecture here the other day on shopping in France and England, says that Englishmen are as fond of shopping as women.

"Englishmen are always running in to their 'court' tailors, 'court' grocers, 'court' hatters, and so on. They are paying nothing but 'court' visits all day.

"In France the number of English tailors and shoemakers is greatly increasing. Since we have no 'court' business, it is quite the thing for a rich young Frenchman to patronize your 'high life' tailors, while, if he wants to be very well, he sends all his linen to be washed in England.

"The difference between the Englishwoman's and Frenchwoman's way of shopping is that, while the Englishwoman is always at it, the Frenchwoman does most of hers in May and October. Over here women seem to talk of nothing else; even if a friend wants you to do anything special one day it is always, 'Oh, I can't possibly; I'm going out shopping.'

"In France shopkeepers do not dress their windows so well as they do in London. As a matter of fact, they are afraid of their models being copied and they dare not make much of a display. But French shopassistants are much more persuasive. In England even the men set aside certain days for shopping."


