DOMINION CANNED GOODS EXAMINED BY EXPERTS

Their Report Very Favorable to the Manufacturers—Hardly One Per Cent Showed Signs of Decomposition—322 Samples Got Together from All Over the Dominion, Including the Maritime Provinces.

OTTAWA, July 28.—(Special)—Hon. Sydney Fisher asked his department some time ago to investigate and report upon sanitary conditions and slaughter houses of Canada.

He reports that a collection of canned meats was made as they are offered for sale in the Dominion, and on equal number of samples as put up by manufacturers in the United States.
