AMONG those on the program at a meeting of the eastern dairymen of Ontario was the Hon. John Dryden who attended the Stock breeders Association held in Charlottetown some weeks ago. An exchange says:—The Hon. John Dryden gave a most instructive and inspiring address dealing chiefly with the man behind the cow. The farmer is the most important in the whole crowd, because he has the raw material to deal with. It is hard to reach delinquents. At the Farmers' Institutes and large conventions only the best farmers are reached. The instructors employed by the Association were devoting too much time to milk-testing. There whole time should be taken up in instructing the maker and the patron. That is what the increased grant was given for. Farmers must be educated to be honest; cannot compel him to be so by law. Instructions should arrange for meetings of patrons and all factories should be visited as much as possible. There were parts of the provinces never reached by the dairy associations. He expressed himself as being delighted that the Governor-General had graced the convention with his presence. Lord Minto had done himself credit by such an act.

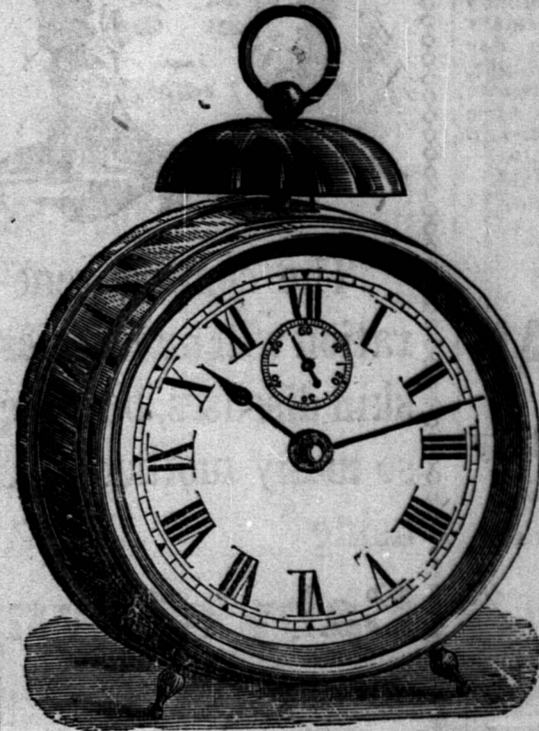
