McBride, who has been in Halifax for some time past as assistant superintendent of the Reconstruction of Painting at Halifax and Manager of the McBride Paint Co., has returned to Charlottetown where he will resume business and can be found at the Eldon Hotel. Mr. McBride's many friends will be glad to welcome him back at this busy season.

NEW VOCATIONAL OFFICES.—Mr. Ernest Parkman, city, has been awarded the contract for building new vocational offices, training and gymnasium quarters at the Convalescent Home. This will mean that Ward A. will be used as offices for those in charge of the above department. The former poultry house on the Government grounds will be completely remodelled and changed over into a garage and automobile repair department, where the men will be trained in the various parts of the work connected with the making and repair of autos. A building on the grounds which formerly was used as a canteen is also being remodelled and will be used for the various trades in vocational training. The former coach-house will also be completely remodelled and used as a carpenter and cabinet making shop.

George Taylor, beloved by the boys in khaki and esteemed by all, will give an Easter Message from the front, to the citizens of Charlottetown in the Prince Edward Theatre Easter Sunday next beginning promptly at 4 and closing at 5 p. m. During the service Mr. Charles Earle has kindly consented to sing a solo. This mass meeting is under the direction of the Charlottetown Y. M. C. A., and by request will be open to all men and women. There will be no collection, as Mr. Gallaher has kindly offered the use of the Prince Edward Theatre for this occasion free of charge. The clergy and directors of the Y. M. C. A. are invited to take seats on the platform and every body is welcome. Other papers please pass this invitation along the line, for Easter Sunday afternoon's meeting.

SOLDIERS GRAVES.—Photographs of the graves of all Canadian soldiers buried overseas are being taken under the direction of Major General Pöblien Ware, Director-General of Graves Registration and Enquiries. Many thousands of applications for photographs have been received by the directorate, but it will be some time before every request can be dealt with. The delay is due to the small number of photographers available for this work and the difficulties arising from demobilization requirements in providing transports to the various cemeteries which are scattered over a large territory.

TO BENEFIT BAKERS.—Bakers will be interested to know that one of the benefits instituted by the Canada Food Board under the licensing system is to be continued as a private undertaking. This is the educational side of baking, in which an effort was made to improve the standard of bread-making by applying latest knowledge of processes and methods. Mr. W. H. Linn, late Chief of the Bakery Section of the Food Board, is now consulting and advisory baking expert at Ottawa, and will deal with any trade difficulties.

ISLANDER INJURED.—Among those injured as the result of the explosion of the main boiler of the S. S. Cape Breton while the ship was on the way from St. John's, Nfld., to Sydney was the third engineer William Campbell of Cardigan, P. E. I. He with the other injured men are now in hospital in St. John's Nfld. The Chief and second engineer were killed by the explosion and three other members of the crew, Campbell is in a serious condition. The concussion was so great that the boiler was moved nine inches from its bed and the hatches of the ship blown off. Had she been loaded so as to offer resistance, the damage no doubt would have been much greater. The Captain and others of the crew are suffering considerably from the shock, but escaped serious injury. The ship was towed back to port by the S. S. Argyle. The examination certificate of the boiler expired while she was in port on the 25th of March, and was to have been renewed on the ship's arrival in Nova Scotia, she being under Canadian regulations.

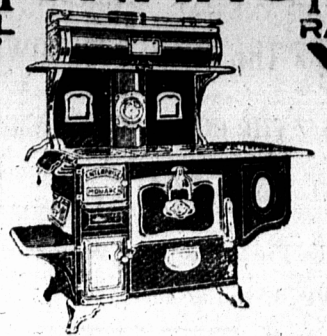

Kaiser as Profiteer

But reverting to the Kaiser's fortune, it is known to be very large and is more than suspected of having been greatly augmented by the war. William Holzschollern, it is said, was a partner with Albert Ballin in an organization formed to supply the German armies with food supplies and made millions of dollars out of his own subjects and victims. He was a large shareholder in Ballin's peace-time enterprises and in the Krupp's industries. For a time he was a member of the notorious "Princes' Trust" in Germany, but drew out before disaster overwhelmed it. He was also an investor in foreign securities, and is supposed to have been a particularly large holder of Pennsylvania and New York Railway and Steel Trust stocks. His land holdings in Western Canada are also believed to have been extensive, but apparently he was able either to sell out his foreign investments or to so cleverly conceal

The King Costs Nothing

The one monarch in Europe who costs the country nothing to maintain is King George of England. When Queen Victoria came to the throne the value of Crown property, or rather the revenues from it, which was, in fact, the revenue from the possessions of former Kings that she had inherited, just about equalled the civil list voted to her and her family by Parliament. Therefore she decided it to the nation for the term of her life in return for the civil list. King Edward followed the same practice and King George likewise. In the meantime it has happened that the Crown properties have greatly increased in value, while the civil list has remained almost stationary, so that the nation really makes money out of its royal family. The King's private fortune is considerable, and is derived from the frugality and wise investments of the Prince Consort and Queen Victoria. It may be shocking to some readers to inform them that a good part of it comes from Scotch whisky

distilleries established at Balmoral by his grandfather, King Edward did not leave his son much money, as he himself had not been favored in this respect by Victoria, who left most of her estate to his son, the Duke of Connaught, and her grandson, the present King.
