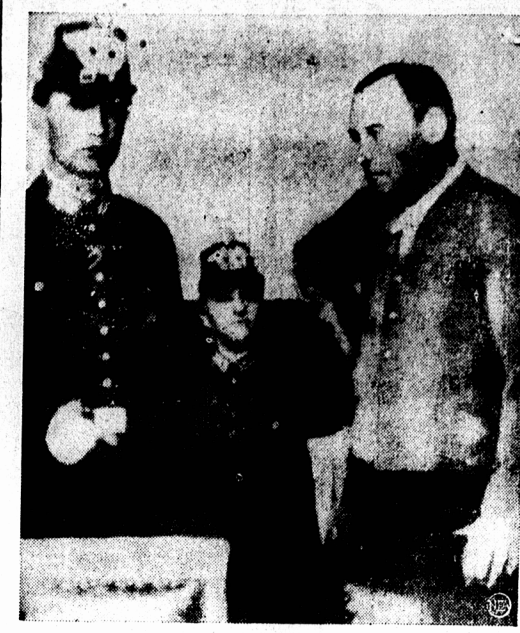

S. Sixteen students attended from all parts of Nova Scotia. Nine were successful tests, published and unpublished.
