LORD KITCHENER FOR WORLD PEACE

CHICAGO, April 17—Lord Kitchener of Khartoum became "Kitchener of Chicago" for exactly one hour and thirty minutes today, surrendering gracefully to a surprise attack by a reporter who boarded the train on the outskirts of the city, Lord Kitchener asked and answered questions with good humor. On militarism the General spoke guardedly, saying: "One must be careful when a thoughtless word might be wrongfully taken to mean something one did not intend it to."

"As to Canada's military future, I haven't visited Canada. I see no aggressiveness in the future, so far as Canada is concerned. The little navy they are building is a little easier on my eyes. One rests better with a 'hobby' walking around the square. I suppose they will some day begin to increase the army just for the same reason."

"I see no reason that international peace should not continue from this very moment. One never knows, however, when something may stir up trouble, and war does not often announce itself far in advance. It always pays to keep one's powder dry."

"Is that an expression of Britain's military policy?" Lord Kitchener was asked.

"Well, I should not put it that broadly. Britain is at peace with all the world, but our surest safeguard of peace is always to be ready. Until such time as some international agreement shall be reached, if such there be, Britain will be ready at all times to lend that influence towards peace."

McLEOD TO BE BROUGHT BACK TO HALIFAX.

HALIFAX, April 17—A cablegram received by Chief of Police Rudland Saturday from Detective Handrahan states that Harold G. McLeod, the Halifax man under arrest in London on the charge of stealing \$650 from a Halifax woman, was this morning formally committed for surrender by the magistrate.

McLeod has fought extradition at London, but Detective Handrahan and W. J. O'Hearn have been successful in securing his extradition. Under the law McLeod has 15 days in which to apply for a writ of habeas corpus or other legal process. It will be several weeks before Messrs. O'Hearn and Handrahan can reach Halifax with their prisoner.

DROWNED WHILE PINNED UNDER HEAVY LOGS.

ST. JOHN, April 17—The first fatal accident on the lumber drives in this section of the Province this spring, occurred at Wickham, Queens County, on Thursday afternoon about one o'clock, when John Beatty, of Gagetown, was thrown into the river by a bro of logs and pinned down in about four feet of water, where he was drowned. The deceased and his nephew, Manford Beatty, were getting the logs cut into the river and had been working on them all morning.
