The fourth meeting of the Quarterly Official Board of the Pownal Circuit was held on Wednesday evening, May 15th, Rev. E. E. Styles presiding. The Financial Statement was read by Giles H. Jenkins and, unfortunately, showed a deficiency on minister's salary. Some districts had exceeded last year's amount while others had fallen short of it. The chairman pointed out not only the inequality of ministers being liable to come short of their salary, but also of the embarrassment which any delay in making up the present deficiency will place him in just at this time when he is unavoidably incurring the heavy expense of a furlough. A high tribute was paid both to the officers and members who, as a whole, had done nobly in supporting the work. But it was felt that some are unworthy mean, giving but a fraction of what they ought to give and what they are able to give. It was unanimously decided to set forth raising the balance forthwith, and the meeting adjourned until 7 p. m. Monday, May 26th, in order to bring up the arrears. The members of the Board for the ensuing year were elected with but little change in the personnel. Giles H. Jenkins was unanimously re-elected Recording Steward. He was also elected to attend the forthcoming District meeting. The membership schedule showed a small net decrease due almost entirely to death and emigration. It was stated that several persons had asked for weekly subscription envelopes, and the opinion of the Board was that if the weekly envelope system were generally adopted it would make the work much easier and better results would be achieved. One of the best signs of the times is the perfect harmony and mutual confidence which exists between the members of this Board.
