Navy at Mercy Of 16 Year Lad

Youngster Who Experiments With Wireless Telegraphy Interferes With Messages - How He Intercepted Messages Between U.S. Ships

WASHINGTON, D. C. May 28.—By courtesy simply by the courtesy of a sixteen-year-old boy—the wireless station at the Washington Navy Yard is able to keep up business. Hugo Stahl, the sixteen-year-old son of a policeman, is something of a wireless prodigy, and from his home near the Navy Yard, communicates through the air with his friend Harry Loveless, who lives at Thirteenth and R. streets, N. W., about two miles away. After their knowledge and skill with wireless telegraphy had passed the experimental stage their aerial activity came to the notice of the Navy Yard wireless station in a most pointed fashion. Official messages from Annapolis, from Hampton Road, from small war ships making up and down the Potomac were strangely interrupted. The boy operators began to hear strange words—naval terms—which neither had heard before. Wireless interference is no new thing to the navy operators, but customarily it has suffered from electrical machinery in the yard or from passing street cars. That had been overcome, but a new trouble had arisen which could not be traced for a long time. The commandant of the Navy Yard was notified. At length the source of the trouble was located in young Stahl's wireless apparatus, rigged up at the rear window of the second storey flat in which his family lives, at No. 238 Twelfth street, S. E.

According to navy methods, complaint was made through official channels which led finally to the courts of the District of Columbia. A representative of the District Government called upon the boy. He was shown the wireless outfit, and saw how well it worked, but there is no law to prevent young Stahl from sitting at his key and sending electrical waves into the outside atmosphere. Recently, when President

Roosevelt was coming up to Potomac from Jamestown, on the May flower, young Stahl got messages from the Mayflower which were intended for the Navy Yard.

The Navy Department has the matter of this interference under consideration, but it is more or less helpless. The most eminent lawyers have only a hazy idea of the statutory restrictions which should be provided. They do not know how much further wireless telegraphy may be developed. Its commercial value has become so great that its monopolization by the Government, except in time of war, is a total impracticability.

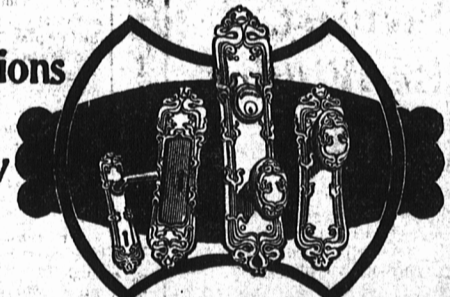
