Stock Markets At A Glance

CHICAGO, Sept. 6 — (AP) — Eye futures advanced as much as 3-8 cents a bushel at times today, with the September contract reaching a seasonal high of 153 3-4, on short covering which met a lack of offerings. Profit-taking caused prices to slump considerably near the close, however.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 6 — (CP) — Moving irregularly during the session, eye futures closed 3-8 lower to 1-2 cent a bushel higher today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange.

NEW YORK, Sept. 6 — (AP) — The Stock Market took the President's message in stride today with leading industrials and utilities hitting peaks for the last eight years and rails rallying at the last.

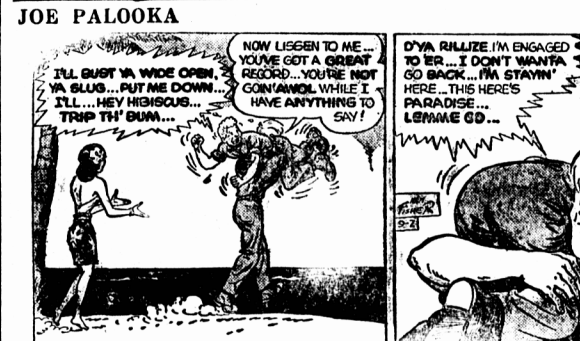
Transfers of 1,380,000 shares compared with 990,000 the day before and were the largest since Aug. 27. The Associated Press 60-stock composite rose .8 of a point to 68.4, a top since May 8, 1937. The industrial average achieved a high since Aug. 31, 1937 and the utilities reached their best level since May 20, 1937. Scout News and Notices

Says Sir Malcolm Robertson, British M.P. "The youth movement which has the greatest conception of life is the Boy Scout Movement. For the good of our country this organization should be extended throughout the country and throughout the world."

John A. Stiles, O.B.E., Chief Executive Commissioner of the Boy Scouts of Canada, returned this week from a two month visit to Great Britain where plans were drawn for the post-war co-operation between the British and Canadian Boy Scout Movements.

Latest record of decorations awarded to Boy Scouts in the Empire show that of 152 Victoria Crosses awarded. It has been awarded to former Scouts. Over 880 other awards for gallantry have been conferred on members of the Movement during the present war, incomplete records show.

For the first time since the outbreak of war in 1939 there has been a large exchange of visits between Canadian and U.S. Boy Scouts during the past summer. Many groups of U.S. Scouts visited Canadian Scout camps and groups of Canadian Scouts visited American camps while small groups made tours of border states.

Official announcement has been made by the International Bureau of the Boy Scouts in London, that the first post-war International Scout Jamboree will be held in France in 1947. Paris will likely be the site of the gathering and it is likely that Canada will send a strong delegation. The largest Scout Jamboree, held at Blenheim in England in 1929, attracted 50,000 Boy Scouts from 40 different countries and 43 parts of the British Empire and Commonwealth.

Major H.F.C. Brides, M.P. recently appointed Minister of Fisheries in the Federal Cabinet says that Netherlands' Boy Scouts were invaluable when allied troops occupied Holland. Their work of greatest importance was their assistance in establishing emergency hospitals for civilian casualties. They would collect beds and bedding from all sorts of sources. They received no pay, and were too proud to accept tips. Without their assistance I don't know how we could have carried on so successfully as we did. Major Brides.
