school meals. Independent schools will remain but they will be subject to inspection to ensure the necessary standards. No attempt has been made to eliminate the present public schools but the white paper forces the time when they will be associated with the national plan. Legislation embodying the proposals will, it is estimated, ultimately involve an additional annual expenditure on education of \$27,000,000 (\$36,500,000, two thirds of which will be borne by the government and the remainder by an increase in the education tax rate.
