WHAT WILL THEY DO?

What will the Conservative party do in the present emergency in regard to prohibition? That is the question of the hour.

They have strong material to work with. One hundred and twenty out of 148 constituencies in the English speaking provinces declared in favor of prohibition.

As for the Senate that is well known to be two-thirds Conservative. No Conservative leader has yet found himself unable to command a majority of that body on any emergent question affecting the party welfare.

The way is therefore clearly open to Sir Charles and Mr. Foster to give the country the measure which the people demanded by the plebiscite and which Sir Wilfrid refuses them.

The attitude of the prohibitionists of Canada toward the Conservative leaders has been and still is one of expectancy, almost painful in its intensity. So far, we regret to find the leaders have given no sign.

Prohibition, deserted almost at the marriage altar by a false lover, might be consoled by a new alliance. She will hardly be contented with the mere offer of assistance in vituperating the deserter.

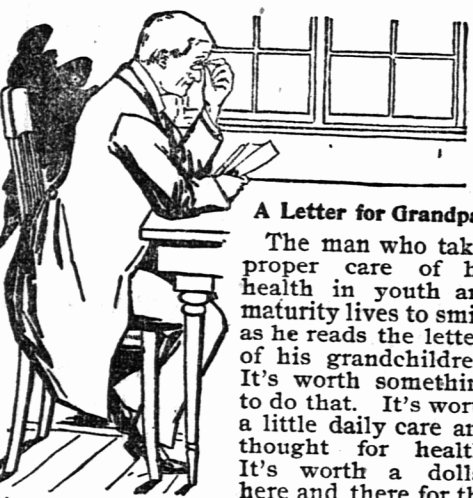
