Notes by the Way

The King Government has purchased a building to house Hon. Vincent Massey and his staff in Washington and Parliament shortly before prorogation voted half a million dollars to pay for it.

Its readers will understand from the above quoted lines what the chief Liberal journal in Canada has to say of the purchase. That is not all. The United States Government is just now negotiating for a modest home in a residential district of Ottawa for the American Ambassador.

Before the Washington purchase Parliament had voted \$130,000 to run the Massey Embassy for a year. Of this amount \$12,000 was to pay the Ministers' salary and the balance for entertainment and other expenditures.

We made the statement in this column a few days ago that "neither in the old Testament nor in the New is prohibition commanded, either for the individual or for the nation."

The New Brunswick Act provides a "Control Commission" composed of three members: The Rev. Mr. Fulton whom we all know to be chairman of this Commission.

THE PROMOTION OF TEMPERANCE IN P. E. ISLAND

No. 9:—Temperance Laws of Sister Provinces.

The lines upon which the temperance law that will be established in this province, if the policy of the Premier Stewart should be endorsed by the electors, have been laid down. They will probably be further explained before the election day.

According to the Ontario Act all the liquor contained in the Province must be purchased through the Government's agency; and all persons who buy and drink liquor must obtain "permits" to do so.

Liquor is not, according to the Act, to be consumed by any person in any public place. All intoxicants must be partaken of in the residence or temporary home of the person.

SINUS TROUBLE

That many cases of asthma, bronchitis, and even tuberculosis of the lungs, may be caused by infection from the sinuses, or little caverns that adjoin the nose, is now admitted.

The tuberculous that comes from this sinus infection is different from the ordinary type in that the patient goes along for years with none of the severe symptoms like spitting up blood, is not very pale, and has no organisms of tuberculosis in the sputum.

Dr. Broughton, a Toronto physician, likens this to a chronic broncho-pneumonia. He records a case of asthma that reacted to the ragweed pollen, but vaccines made no improvement on the condition.

Now sometimes the ordinary "head cold" starts up this trouble in the sinuses, and sometimes the sinus starts up a fresh head cold.

The influenza that swept through the country in 1918 and 1919 left many individuals with a chronic sinusitis, as it is called.

What about this? Well if a sinus infection can cause bronchitis, asthma, or even tuberculosis and you have a little suspicion in your mind that you have trouble there, have your family doctor refer you to a good nose and throat specialist.

In fact with the new instruments for examination, now in the hands of the family doctor, he can at least make the examination, even if he sends you to the specialist for treatment.
