Gold Stocks Strong At Toronto; Others Steady

Mining

TORONTO, July 4—

TORONTO, July 4—(CP)—Gold stocks climbed to the highest level since late April as they marked up the best adding 35 cents at close today's session on the Toronto Stock Exchange.

The list showed a gain of more than three points at the close on the exchange's index. It was the busiest session since May 31 with volume in the last hour almost equal to the total for the first four hours and almost all activity in mining issues.

The sudden closing lift in golds added to the rise in other metals. Junior gold producers showed advances ranging up to 25 cents. It didn't take much to lift prices five, 10 and 15 cents. Seniors were very strong with McIntyre, selling odd lot for some time, leading on a gain of 2 1/4 at 62.

Eldona was about the busiest stock on the board, turning over some 120,000 shares for 10-cent advance. Waite Amulet sparked in base metals adding 35 cents at 82 1/2. Noranda, Smelters, Labrador, Quebec and Hudson Bay were also features as the group turned actively.

Western oils were irregular with Anglo-Canadian, Calgary and Edmonton and Royalite added five to 15 cents.

The exchange's closing index showed golds up 3.37 at 99.85, base metals up 1.68 at 86.12, western oils up 1.43 at 43.30.

Gold listed 100 gains, 8 losses, 26 unchanged; base metals, 22 gains, 2 losses, 2 unchanged; western oils, 4 gains, 6 losses, 4 unchanged.
